Overview of Queensland liquor and wine licence fees and charges

All liquor licences in Queensland are subject to a base fee plus any additional fee calculated by the risk criteria. The risk criteria relate to trading hours, service practices and compliance history.

All fees are indexed annually. **Annual fees are payable by 31 July each year.** The liquor licence will be automatically suspended, and then cancelled after 28 days, if the fee remains outstanding. The wine licence will be automatically suspended and cancelled after 14 days if the fee remains outstanding.

If you are a current liquor or wine licensee **as of 30 June 2020**, your 2020–21 fees will be waived.

Licensees are not eligible for a pro-rata refund of their 2019–20 liquor licence fees.

For new licensees in 2020–21, you will be required to pay your annual licence fee on a pro-rata basis for the relevant licence type and risk criteria (if applicable).

If your liquor licence is cancelled, your gaming licence will be automatically cancelled. If this occurs, gaming activities must cease. Your licensed monitoring operator will be advised to disable all gaming machines. All hotel operating authorities or club entitlements will be forfeited to the state, with no opportunity for redress. If this occurs, licensees have to reapply for a gaming licence and purchase new operating authorities or entitlements at market rates.
