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Guide to making a notification regarding incorrect stamping of instruments

Do not return this guide with the completed form. Retain the guide for future reference.

Am I required to complete a notification?

You are required to complete and lodge a notification regarding incorrect stamping of instruments (Form QRO—D14.1) if you act under an instrument that has not been properly stamped. An instrument is properly stamped if:

- (a) any duty imposed on the instrument or the transaction to which it relates and any assessed interest or penalty tax is paid in full
- or
- (b) no duty is imposed on the instrument or the transaction to which it relates because of an exemption under the *Duties Act 2001* or another Act.

What are my obligations?

If you act under an instrument that has not been properly stamped, you are required to lodge your notification immediately, along with the instrument and any supporting evidence as to why the instrument has not been properly stamped. Failure to do so is an offence under the *Duties Act 2001* unless you can prove that you did not know and could not reasonably have been expected to know that duty was imposed on the instrument or the transaction to which it relates, or that the instrument was not properly stamped.

How to complete a notification

This form has 5 parts (labelled A–E) and smaller questions within each part numbered individually. When completing this form, please print or type all responses in boxed spaces and tick appropriate boxes. If there is insufficient space, please attach additional forms or pages.

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
