DIRECTIVE No. 14/14

Supersedes: 8/14

Commission Chief Executive Directive: G20 Leaders' Summit Employment Conditions

1. Purpose:

To prescribe conditions of employment for employees who have been deployed to perform duties (including training) associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit.

2. Effective date: 17 October 2014

3. Legislative provisions:

Sections 23, 52(2) and 53 of the Public Service Act 2008.

4. Application:

This directive applies to all public service employees who nominate and are approved for deployment to perform duties (including the required training) associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit.

Directive

5. Operation:

5.1. The conditions contained in applicable and relevant industrial instruments and directives will continue to apply during the period of deployment except to the extent varied by this directive.

6. Duties and responsibilities:

6.1. An employee deployed under this directive may be required to perform a range of duties to deliver ground transportation and event services in connection with the G20 Leaders' Summit.

7. Training requirement

7.1. An employee deployed to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit will be required to undertake and satisfactorily complete specified training activities prior to the commencement of their official duties.

8. Hours of work

- 8.1. An employee deployed to perform duties associated the G20 Leaders' Summit may be required to participate in shift or continuous shift work arrangements when performing official G20 duties.
- 8.2. The hours of work for an employee participating in shift or continuous shift work arrangements shall be determined exclusively by the event organisers and be outlined in the form of a roster which will set out the employee's days of duty and starting and finishing times.



- 8.3. Rosters may only incorporate shifts which fall into the following categories:
 - (a) afternoon shift, which means all work performed as part of a shift that finishes after 6.00 p.m. and at or before midnight, if the majority of hours for the shift are between 6.00 p.m. and midnight;
 - (b) *night shift*, which means all work performed as part of either of the following:
 - (i) a shift finishing after midnight and at or before 8.00 a.m.; or
 - (ii) a shift if the majority of hours for the shift are between midnight and 8.00 a.m.;
 - (c) day shift, which means all work performed as part of a shift which does not meet the criteria specified for an afternoon or night shift.
- 8.4. In accordance with section 9A subsections (2)(a) and (13) of the *Industrial Relations Act* 1999:
 - (a) the periods for which a deployed employee is required to work must not exceed six days in any seven consecutive days;
 - (b) anytime worked outside any period mentioned above is considered overtime.
- 8.5. Arrangements prescribed in relevant industrial instruments which require an employer to allow employees access to rostered day(s) off in any work cycle do not apply whilst an employee performs duties in connection with the G20 Leaders' Summit.

9. Overtime

- 9.1. Hours worked by an employee when participating in shift or continuous shift work arrangements in connection with official G20 duties, which are:
 - (a) outside of the ordinary hours prescribed by the employee's industrial instruments; or
 - (b) before or after the starting or finishing time which the employee is rostered to work on a day

will be considered overtime and attract overtime rates of double time.

- 9.2. The accrued time arrangements prescribed in Schedule 5 of the *Queensland Public* Service Award State 2012 do not apply whilst an employee performs training or duties in connection with the G20 Leaders' Summit.
- 9.3. Clauses 7.2 and 7.3 or as amended of the directive relating to hours, overtime and excess travel do not apply to an employee covered by the directive whilst the employee is deployed to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit.

10. Transportation

10.1. An employee deployed to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit is required to transport themselves to and from their residence and their usual place of work for the G20 deployment. This travel time is not considered official travel for the purposes of the directive relating to hours, overtime and excess travel. Subject to clause 10.2, compensation will not be provided to reimburse an employee for any associated travel expenses incurred.

- 10.2. Where an employee is required to transport themselves to or from their residence and public transport is not available or is considered a safety risk, the employee is entitled to taxi vouchers, or reimbursement of taxi fares on production of a receipt, as compensation for transporting themselves home.
- 10.3. While an employee is deployed to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit, the provisions of the directive relating to domestic travelling and relieving expenses shall not apply.

11. Special leave

11.1. Chief executives must consider granting special leave with pay to employees approved for deployment to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit to assist in managing any fatigue impacts associated with the deployment.

12. Dictionary

Continuous shift work means work done by an employee where the hours of work are rotated throughout the duration of deployment in accordance with a shift roster covering a 24 hour per day operation.

Shift work (other than continuous shift work) means work rotated throughout the duration of deployment in accordance with a roster which prescribes two or more shifts (day, afternoon or night) per day, but does not cover a 24 hour per day operation.

Usual place of work means specified training or work locations employees are required to attend when deployed to perform duties associated with the G20 Leaders' Summit.
