# Application for authority to transfer a corporation's incorporation from RECI Act

#### **IMPORTANT – PRIOR NOTIFICATIONS AND APPROVALS**

A change in corporate structure from the *Religious Educational and Charitable Institutions Act 1861* to the *Corporations Act 2001* (Corporations Act) or to the *Corporations (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander) Act 2006* (CATSI Act) may affect any existing property, rights or obligations with government funding agencies, affiliated bodies or accreditation bodies.

Existing property, rights or obligations may not be recognised despite section 601BM of the Corporations Act or part 2-3 of the CATSI Act which provide that registration under the relevant parts of those Acts does not:

- (a) create a new legal entity; or
- (b) affect the body's existing property, rights or obligations (except as against the members of the body in their capacity as members); or
- (c) render defective any legal proceedings by or against the body or its members.

Consequently corporations should consider what approvals, if any, they should obtain **before** calling a general meeting of members to consider a change in corporate structure.

Corporations are responsible for making their own enquiries as the Office of Fair Trading can not to do so on their behalf.

Examples of arrangements which may be affected and notifications which should be made or approvals sought are:

- 1. Corporations that have been appointed as trustee of trust land or hold a lease under the *Land Act 1994* should notify the chief executive of the Department of Natural Resources and Mines to ensure their tenancy arrangements will not be affected by their proposed change of corporate structure;
- 2. Associations that have gaming or liquor licences should notify the chief executive of the Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation, Department of Justice and Attorney-General to ensure their licences will not be affected by their proposed change of corporate structure;
- 3. A corporation that is the governing body of a provisionally accredited or accredited non-State school under the *Education* (Accreditation of Non-State Schools) Act 2001 must obtain prior approval under that Act of the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board.
