Research Guide to Dunwich and Eventide records at Queensland State Archives

Queensland State Archives (QSA) is the official repository for Queensland Government records selected for permanent retention because of their continuing value. The archived public records are from state government departments, state courts, local government authorities and statutory authorities. The records are in our facility at <u>Runcorn, Brisbane</u>, and open records are available for viewing in the Reading Room, free-of-charge.

The Dunwich Benevolent Asylum was established on 13 May 1865 when residents were first transferred to the Dunwich Quarantine Station from the Benevolent Ward at the Brisbane Hospital. Dunwich Benevolent Asylum operated until 30 September 1946, when it was officially closed. Dunwich Benevolent Asylum residents were gradually transferred to Eventide Home, Sandgate, which was officially opened on 4 October 1946. The function of the Dunwich Benevolent Asylum was defined in the *Benevolent Asylum Wards Act 1861* and the *Charitable Institutions Act 1885* as the care of the aged and infirmed, and the destitute who were unable to care for themselves. Eligibility criteria for admission to Eventide Home was similar to the criteria applied to applicants to Dunwich Benevolent Asylum.

The main finding aid for records held at QSA is the <u>Queensland State Archives' online catalogue</u> (known as ArchivesSearch).

The following citation abbreviations are used throughout our catalogue:

- ITM QSA Item (describes the item)
- PR Physical Representation (generally the original or microfilm copy)
- DR Digital Representation (for a digital image)
- S Series (for a series of records)
- A Agency (for the creating or responsible agency)

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander readers are advised that our catalogue contains images, names and voices of people who have died.

Many of the records about Dunwich Benevolent Asylum and Eventide Home are subject to a 100 year restricted access period. Researchers may apply for access to restricted records through <u>ArchivesSearch</u>. Access to restricted records is granted at the discretion of the responsible agency.

Colonial Secretary's Office

Home Secretary's Office

From about 1904, registers for each year are arranged by subjects, such as general, charitable relief, benevolent asylums, and institutional (various institutions such as Diamantina Hospital, Dunwich and Charters Towers Benevolent Asylums as well as broader headings such as prisoners, relief and indigents). Some registers have an extended description such as Register of letters received concerning the work of benevolent asylums and Register of letters received from institutions, etc. These registers are used to find letters in S5263, General Correspondence.

The special batches series consists of batches of correspondence and papers removed from, or not included in the general correspondence of the Colonial Secretary's/Home Secretary's Office, and the subsequent Health and Home Affairs Department and Health Department. Letters were removed, either for administrative convenience or because the subject was particularly important. They were entered in the Registers of Letters Received, with a note often specifying 'Away' Batch.
