## NOTIFICATION OF DANGER TO MARINE SAFETY

Maritime Safety Queensland Brisbane, 16 July 2020

## I, Jonathan Beatty, Acting Regional Harbour Master, Maritime

**Safety Queensland**, pursuant to section 197(2) of the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Regulation 2016* (the Regulation), state that the waters described in Schedule A are waters where the anchoring, berthing, mooring or operating of a ship mentioned in schedule B endangers marine safety.

#### SCHEDULE A

## Noosa River Commercial PWC Area

The waters of the Noosa River bounded by an imaginary line -

- starting at a point in the vicinity of the outer extremity of the line of mangroves on the north side of the Noosa River at approximate latitude 26°23.580' south, longitude 153°04.046' east
- then to a point in the Noosa River at latitude 26°23.636' south, longitude 153°04.067' east
- then to a point in the Noosa River at latitude 26°23.650' south, longitude 153°04.060' east

- starting at a point in the vicinity of the outer extremity of the line of mangroves on the north side of the Maroochy River at approximate latitude 26°38.366' south, longitude 153°04.687' east;
- then to a point in the Maroochy River at latitude 26°38.404' south, longitude 153°04.687' east;
- then to a point in the Maroochy River at latitude 26°38.415' south, longitude 153°04.675' east;
- then generally westerly to a point in the Maroochy River at latitude 26° 38.417 south, longitude 153°04.422' east;
- then to a point in the Maroochy River at latitude 26°38.407' south, longitude 153°04.410' east;
- then to a point in the vicinity of the outer extremity of the line of mangroves on the north side of the Maroochy River at approximate latitude 26°38.352' south, longitude 153°04.410' east; and
- then generally easterly along the outer extremity of the line of mangroves on the north side of the Maroochy River to the starting point.

#### **SCHEDULE B**

At any time from sunrise to sunset a ship other than

 (a) a nominated PWC;

- (b) a ship operated as a rescue ship by the provider of a nominated PWC;
- (c) a ship operated by any of the following entities, if the ship is being operated in the course of the entity's activities –

- a volunteer marine rescue association or an accredited surf lifesaving club;
- (ii) Queensland Fire and Emergency Services;
- (iii) Water Police, Queensland Police Service;
- (iv) Queensland Boating and Fisheries Patrol;
- (v) Maritime Safety Queensland.

At any time when there are 10 other nominated PWC being operated in the commercial PWC area by persons other than the provider — a nominated PWC operated by a person other than the provider.

**nominated PWC** means a personal watercraft that

- (a) is certified as a class 4 personal watercraft under the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012* (Cwlth); and
- (b) displays a unique identifier as defined under that Act on both sides of the personal watercraft in characters at least 100mm high; and
- (c) is approved in writing by the Area Manager, North Brisbane/Sunshine Coast to operate in the area.

**provider** includes an employee of the provider.

**accredited surf life saving club** has the same meaning as in schedule 9 of the regulation.

## NOTIFICATION OF EXEMPTION

**I**, **Jonathan Beatty, Acting Regional Harbour Master, Maritime Safety Queensland**, pursuant to section 18A of the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994*, exempt persons operating personal watercraft (PWC) from the provision of chapter 5, part 3, section 82(1)(a)(v) of the *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Regulation 2016* prohibiting the operation of a PWC at a speed of more than 6 knots within 60m of the shore, subject to the following conditions.

#### CONDITIONS

The PWC must

- be a nominated PWC as defined in the gazette notice titled Notification of Danger to Marine Safety published in this number of the Queensland Government Gazette (the gazette notice) associated with the Noosa River and Maroochy River waterways.
- be operating in either the Noosa River Commercial PWC Area or the Maroochy River Commercial PWC Area as defined in the gazette notice.
- be operated in compliance with Marine Order 504 (Certificates of operation and operation requirements national law) 2018 and the safety management system, as required under the *Marine Safety (Domestic Commercial Vessel) National Law Act 2012* (Cwlth).
- be operated only between sunrise and sunset.
- not be operated at a speed of more than 6 knots within 10 metres of the shore.
