The reason for the declaration is to achieve a high level of access control to:

- Ensure that the urban arterial function of the Road is preserved.
- Protect the ability to provide and enhance public and active transport options in the future.
- Protect the ability to provide additional capacity to accommodate growth in traffic volumes were required.

Any person whose interests are affected by the declaration may:

- (1) under section 485 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* – ask for the decision to make the declaration to be reviewed by the Chief Executive;
- (2) under the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994*, part 5, division 2 – apply for the original decision to be stayed; and
- (3) under the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994*, part 5, division 3 –
 - (a) appeal against the Chief Executive’s decision on the review to the court stated in Schedule 3 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* for the decision; and
 - (b) apply for the reviewed decision to be stayed.

Notice is hereby given that there is a policy in place, in relation to the application of section 62 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* related to access between the Burleigh Connection Road and adjacent land. The policy is set out below.

POLICY FOR BURLEIGH CONNECTION ROAD (102)**1 PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to protect the function, safety and efficiency of the Burleigh Connection Road (102) (the “**Road**”) by setting out the principles that will be applied when making decisions under s 62 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*.

Not permitting any additional direct access to the Road is essential to achieve the vision for the Road set out in section 3 below. Doing this will:

- Ensure that the existing and future urban arterial function of the Road is preserved.
- Protect the ability to provide and enhance public and active transport options in the future.
- Protect the ability to provide additional capacity to accommodate growth in traffic volumes where required.

2 HEAD OF POWER

This policy has been made pursuant to s 54 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*.

3 ROAD VISION

The following vision for the Road sets the context within which the Policy Principles (section 5) and the Policy Strategies (section 6) will be applied:

The Road is a major east-west arterial link. It connects Gold Coast Highway (SCR 11B) and Pacific Motorway (SCR 12A), traversing the Southport-Burleigh Road (SCR 103) near the large industrial precinct at Burleigh Waters. The Road is a four lane, median divided urban road that services residential, industrial and commercial properties, along with shopping centres and schools. Large sections of the link are accessed via service roads such as Casua Drive and Kortum Drive.

The posted speed is 80 km/h west of the Ramly Drive/Sunlight Drive intersection and 60 km/h for the remainder of the Road. The Road shoulders are sealed west of Mattocks Road intersection with kerb and channelling for the remainder of the Road. All major intersections are signalised.

The average annual daily traffic volume on the Road in 2018 was approximately 34 000 with between 4.5% and 10% of the traffic comprising of heavy vehicles. For the ten years up to 2020, the traffic volume on the Road had been growing at an average of 2% per year.

The Road is an approved 23m and 25m B-double freight route from Pacific Motorway (SCR 12A), Varsity Lakes to Taree Street, Burleigh Waters and an approved 23m B-double freight route from Taree Street, Burleigh Waters to West Burleigh Road, Burleigh Heads.

The Road will remain an important east-west arterial link performing a vital network function into the future. It is also intended to perform an important public and active transport function in the future by accommodating bus and cyclist facilities. Upgrading the traffic capacity of the Road beyond four through traffic lanes is generally not intended, however additional capacity will need to be provided in the vicinity of key intersections to accommodate growing traffic volumes. Any additional lanes constructed are intended to be public transit facilities. The South-east Queensland Principle Cycle Network Plan identifies the Road as a 'future principal route'.

The access strategy for the Road is to not permit any additional direct access points onto the Road and to remove or consolidate existing direct access where possible. Access to the Road between the Pacific Motorway and West Burleigh Road is provided via service roads and intersections only. No direct property access exists on this stretch of the Road and this is to be preserved into the future. Where feasible, consideration will be given to extending the existing service road network so new accesses are rationalised and controlled through signalised intersections. Between West Burleigh Road and the Gold Coast Highway, no new direct access will be permitted and where possible existing accesses will be removed or consolidated and the development of a service road network to provide for property access supported.

4 APPLICATION

This policy will be applied in assessing applications made under s 62 or 62A of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*.

This policy will also be applied in:

- the preparation, amendment or review of local, state and federal government planning schemes and other planning instruments to ensure that:
 - land uses reflect the Policy Principles and Policy Strategies and preserve the function of the Road;
 - the local road network is developed to provide access to land where access from the Road is not supported;
 - the vision for the Road identified in section 3 is accommodated; and
- general transport planning relevant to managing access to limited access roads.

5 POLICY PRINCIPLES

When making a decision relating to the management of access between land and the Road, the following principles will be applied:

- vehicular access must not compromise safety of the users of the Road or any other transport infrastructure;
- vehicular access must be consistent with the functional requirements of the Road;
- vehicular access must be consistent with the current or planned intent for the Road corridor and the wider State-controlled road network.

In applying the principles, regard will be had to the following strategies:

- (1) the strategies applying to vehicular access to State-controlled roads set out in the *Vehicular access to state-controlled roads policy*¹; and
- (2) the Policy Strategies set out in section 6.

Where there is inconsistency between the strategies set out in the *Vehicular access to state-controlled roads policy* and the Policy Strategies set out in this policy, the Policy Strategies set out in this policy prevail.

A proposal will be consistent with this policy if it meets the Policy Principles and all relevant Policy Strategies.

6 POLICY STRATEGIES

SAFETY

Principle 1: vehicular access must not compromise safety of the users of the Road or any other transport infrastructure

Safety is paramount in the road environment. Adequate levels of safety must be ensured for all users of the Road, including motorists, pedestrians and cyclists.

Strategy **No Specific Strategy**

FUNCTION

Principle 2: Vehicular access must be consistent with the functional requirements of the Road

The primary function of the Road is to provide an arterial east west link between the Gold Coast Highway and the Pacific Motorway. To preserve this, the through-function of the Road will be protected by not allowing any additional direct property access.

Strategy 1 **Direct vehicular access to the Road will not be permitted.**

All new access for land adjacent to the Road is to be via the service road network and/or an intersection with a local government road. Where feasible, the existing service road network will be extended to provide for access to the Road via controlled intersections.

For that section of the Road to the east of the West Burleigh Road intersection, existing accesses should be removed or, if this is not possible, consolidated. The development of a service road network along this stretch of the Road will be supported where possible.

FUTURE INTENT

Principle 3: Vehicular access must be consistent with the current or planned intent for the Road corridor and the wider network

The Road is to continue performing its current function as an east-west arterial link between the Pacific Motorway and the Gold Coast Highway. To accommodate growing traffic volumes additional capacity will need to be provided at key intersections. To complement this function, the Road is intended to perform an important role in the provision of public and active transport options. The Road is part of the Principal Cycle Network and any additional lanes on the Road are to act as public transport transit corridors.

Strategy 1 **Direct access to the Road will not be permitted.**

Direct access to the Road will not be permitted to preserve the ability to:

- provide for public and active transport options (such as cycleways and transit lanes) in the future,
- to minimize the need for land resumptions from adjoining properties,
- to support the extension of the existing service road network,
- to maintain the ability to provide additional capacity in the vicinity of key intersections where required by growth in traffic volumes.

8 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This policy may be amended at any time without a gazette notice if:

- the amendment merely changes or repeals a specific provision for 1 or more particular properties; and
- the owner or occupier of each property has been given written notice of the amendment.

Any person whose interests are affected by this policy may:

- under s 485 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* – ask for the decision about the policy to be applied to be reviewed;
- under Part 5, Division 2 of the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994* – apply for the original decision to be stayed;
- under Part 5, Division 3 of the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994*:
 - appeal against a decision on a review;
 - apply for the reviewed decision to be stayed.

Under s 61 of the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994*, a person must not construct or change a physical means of entry or exit for traffic between land and a limited access road without first obtaining a decision under s 62(1) that authorises the construction or change. Maximum penalty – 200 penalty units.
