



#### TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No. 3350) 2020

#### Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the Taking of Easement Notice (No. 3350) 2020.

#### Easements to be taken [s.9(6) of the Acquisition of Land Act 1967]

 Easements are taken over land described in the Schedule 2 by the Chief Executive, Department of Transport and Main Roads, as constructing authority for the State of Queensland, for a purpose incidental to the purpose of transport (road), in particular, access easement and vests in the Chief Executive, Department of Transport and Main Roads, as constructing authority for the State of Queensland.

#### **Terms and Conditions of Easements**

3. The terms and conditions of the easements are set out in schedule 1.

#### **SCHEDULE 1**

#### Terms of Easements

The rights and obligations to be conferred and imposed by the proposed Easement for Access purposes over the land described in the schedule includes: -

The full free right and liberty of way and passage for the Department of Transport and Main Roads and its servants, agents, workmen, contractors, invitees and licensees and all other persons with its permission and authority at all times by day or night with or without machinery, plant and equipment, carts, lorries, wagons, trucks, vehicles of any description laden or unladen to enter upon and remain pass and repass in along and over the easement AND without affecting the generality of the foregoing Department of Transport and Main Roads shall have full free liberty and right at all times:-

- (1) to lay down, construct, maintain, repair and renew on, in or through the easement a road of access as the Department of Transport and Main Roads shall consider necessary;
- (2) to clear and keep clear the easement by chemical application or by any other means not harmful to livestock and to cut and remove and to burn off timber, trees and undergrowth as the Department of Transport and Main Roads shall consider necessary; and
- (3) to construct and maintain such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works on the easement as the Department of Transport and Main Roads shall consider necessary.
