

Rest easy, bunk bed safety

Bunk bed safety for short-term rental accommodation

Did you know that there will be new laws governing the use of bunk beds in short-term rental accommodation from October 2013?

Here are seven things you need to know right now.

- The new law is called the Fair Trading (Safety Standards) Regulation 2011 and it comes into effect on 21 October 2013.
- 2. The new bunk bed law applies to anyone who offers short-term accommodation services, where bunk beds could be used by people under 16 years of age.
- 3. Short-term accommodation is defined as 'accommodation supplied in trade or commerce for a period of 60 days or less'.

- 4. Short-term accommodation providers are strongly encouraged to make any necessary changes to their bunk beds to make sure they meet the new mandatory safety standards.
- 5. The Office of Fair Trading has developed a compliance guide and checklist to help accommodation providers meet their new legal obligations and it is available on the Office of Fair Trading website www.fairtrading.qld.gov.au
- 6. The Office of Fair Trading does not recommend any child under nine years of age use a top bunk.
- 7. 85% of bunk bed related injuries are the direct result of a fall from a bunk bed, with most injuries suffered by children aged between 5–9 years old*.
