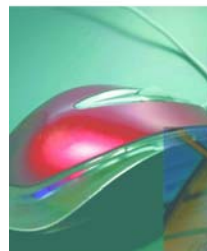

The Queensland Public Service is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants. The Queensland State Government's policy is to seek to retain skilled staff. Registered employees who apply for an advertised job will be considered before other applicants. The symbol (g) appears next to vacancies where an exemption from this requirement applies. Employees are to indicate in their application for the advertised job that they are registered with the Office of the Public Service Commissioner. The Queensland Public Service Commissioner is committed to equal opportunity in employment. Selection will be given on the basis of merit only and fair consideration will be given to all applicants.

**CONTINUOUS APPLICANT POOLS**

A continuous applicant pool allows you to apply for jobs within an occupation where vacancies are regularly available. This means that agencies can 'dip' into the pool for suitable applicants as soon as they have a vacancy. You can submit or refresh your application at any time. If you are refreshing your application, make sure that you indicate this either on your email or, if sending by post, in a covering letter. In search results, continuous applicant pools can be identified by 'Ongoing' in the 'Closes' column of a search result.

Note: If a continuous applicant pool is closing, applicants will be notified two weeks prior to this date. Applications may be used for up to six months after the pool closes.

**MULTI-AGENCY POOLS**

Some Queensland Government agencies are on the lookout for people to fill similar jobs or occupations at the same time. Some of these jobs have a fixed closing date and others are ongoing (continuous applicant pools). With multi-agency pools, you only have to apply once to access job opportunities across participating agencies. Your application will then be able to be viewed and assessed by all the agencies in that pool - or, if you prefer, you can specify that you want to be considered only for particular agencies. Make sure you check the specific vacancy to find out how each pool works.

**HOW TO APPLY**

When you have found the job you would like to apply for.

1. You can phone for a copy of the information kit or you can download the documents from the Smart Jobs and Careers website at [www.jobs.qld.gov.au](http://www.jobs.qld.gov.au). The information kit will include:
  - the position or job description detailing: background of the department or work area; roles and responsibilities, and selection criteria
  - a job information package, outlining the procedure for preparing and sending in your application, and
  - an application cover sheet.
2. Do your homework - research the agency to understand the background to the job.
3. Prepare your application. This should include your:
  - completed cover sheet (available on jobs online or in the kit mailed to you)
  - covering letter
  - resumé / curriculum vitae
  - names and contact details of (2) referees, and
  - responses to the selection criteria if required.
4. Mail or email your application (Details of where and how are available in either the job description or the job information package).

Check with the job vacancy contact person if you are unsure about how or where to submit your application or how many copies to send. Make sure you send your application by the closing date. If you don't, it may not be accepted. Once your application is received, you will usually be sent a written acknowledgement.

### SCHEDULE 6

## State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971

## Rights and Obligations Under Easement

### 1 INTERPRETATION

#### 1.1 In this Schedule:

**"Burdened Land"** means the land over which the Easement is taken.

**"Business Day"** means any day that is not:

- (a) a Saturday or Sunday; or
- (b) a public holiday, special holiday or bank holiday,

in the place in which any relevant act is to, or may, be done.

**"Coordinator-General"** means the Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the Coordinator-General's assigns and where the context permits, the employees, servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement.

**"Easement"** means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

**"Landowner"** means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

**"Structure"** means an improvement, building, structure, gate or fence of any kind.

#### 1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

- 1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.
- 1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the Burdened Land in accordance with the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*.

## **2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL**

- 2.1 The Coordinator-General may, at all times:
- (a) exercise an unrestricted right of way to enter, exit, pass and re-pass (with or without vehicles, trucks, machinery, plant and equipment) over or through the Burdened Land and use the Burdened Land for right of way purposes in common with the Landowner;
  - (b) stand or park vehicles, trucks, machinery, plant and equipment on the Burdened Land and stop, load, unload and temporarily store goods on the Burdened Land for the purpose of and in the course of exercising its other rights under this Easement;
  - (c) construct, install, repair, maintain, add to, alter and replace any roads, driveways or gates in or on the Burdened Land from time to time;
  - (d) remove any obstruction or Structure placed or existing on the Burdened Land irrespective of the reason or means by which the obstruction or Structure came to exist on the Burdened Land (except a Structure erected with the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General, as provided for in clause 3.1(a));
  - (e) inspect or survey the Burdened Land, or any Structure on it, from time to time; and
  - (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Burdened Land (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner).

- 2.2 In exercising its rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General must:

- (a) ensure that any work is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable in the circumstances to the Landowner;
- (c) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety; and
- (d) except in the case of an emergency or where it is not otherwise practicable, give the Landowner reasonable prior notice.

- 2.3 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing an obstruction or Structure erected on the Burdened Land) without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

## **3 OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER**

- 3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not change (other than removing any obstruction or Structure erected on the Burdened Land in breach of the Easement) or erect or permit to be erected any obstruction or Structure (except a road not inconsistent with any road constructed by the Coordinator-General) on the Burdened Land without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) not alter the ground level of the Burdened Land or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Burdened Land by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (c) not plant trees on the Burdened Land without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not crop, dig or plough the Burdened Land or cause the lighting of fires on the Burdened Land, or allow fire to exist on the Burdened Land, without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (e) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the exercise by the Coordinator-General of its rights and powers under the Easement from time to time and if any nuisance is caused, then the Landowner must promptly abate such nuisance;
- (f) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (g) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (h) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Burdened Land to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the exercise by the Coordinator-General of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

3.2 The Landowner is responsible for the acts and omissions of anyone claiming through the Landowner (like tenants, licensees and mortgagees). An act or omission of any of those persons is treated for the purposes of the Easement as if it was an act or omission of the Landowner personally.

#### 4 OTHER MATTERS

##### 4.1 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must:

- (a) stamp (if required) and register the Easement; and
- (b) pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

##### 4.2 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use the Landowner's best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement

legislation, in respect of land which includes the Burdened Land, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

##### 4.3 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document relating to the Burdened Land and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment or transfer or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Burdened Land.

#### 5 NOTICE

##### 5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

##### 5.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

### **6 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT**

- (a) Subject to clause 6(b), the Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so.
- (b) The Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner, subject to clause 6(c), erecting and maintaining any fence across the Burdened Land if:
  - (i) each fence includes a lockable gate in a location consented to in writing by the Coordinator-General; and
  - (ii) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General.
- (c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if in the Coordinator-General's opinion, the fence will interfere with the Coordinator-General's exercise of its rights and powers under the Easement.

### **7 SEVERABILITY**

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the

Easement or would be contrary to public policy.

### **8 INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER**

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("Claims") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights and powers under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution), by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents, contractors, subcontractors, tenants or licensees.

#### **State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 Rights and Obligations Under Easement**

### **1 INTERPRETATION**

#### **1.1 In this Schedule:**

"**Burdened Land**" means the land over which the Easement is taken.

"**Coordinator-General**" means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, and, where



applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

“**Easement**” means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“**Easement Area**” means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is obtained.

“**Infrastructure**” means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

“**Landowner**” means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

“**Project**” means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the Water Regulation 2002.

- 1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

- 1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

- 1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement

may be registered as a public utility easement.

## 2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

### 2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:

- (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
- (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
- (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area;
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and

safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area; and

(e) do so at its own risk.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

2.5 If the Coordinator-General breaches the Easement, the Landowner may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach at the cost and expense of the Coordinator-General, but only after the Landowner notifies the Coordinator-General of the breach and the Coordinator-General does not rectify such breach within 28 days of being notified.

### **3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER**

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);
- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area

without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;

- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
- (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and
- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

## 4 OTHER MATTERS

### 4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the

Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned). The Coordinator-General must maintain its Infrastructure in good order and condition from time to time so as to ensure that no damage is done to person or property on the balance of the Burdened Land.

### 4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;
- (b) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (c) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

### 4.3 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

### 4.5 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

### 4.6 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the

Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

## 5 NOTICE

### 5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

### 5.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

### 5.3 Particulars for delivery of notices

The address and facsimile number of the Coordinator-General and Landowner is that specified below or that which a party specifies by written notice to the other party from time to time:

## 6 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT

- (a) Subject to clause 6(b), the Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so.
- (b) The Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner:
  - (i) maintaining any existing road and services (electricity, telecommunications, gas, water and sewerage) across the Easement Area;
  - (ii) subject to clause 6(c), erecting and maintaining any fence across the Easement Area if:
    - (A) each fence includes a lockable gate in a location agreed with the Coordinator-General;
    - (B) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General; and
  - (iii) Constructing a road or services in the Easement Area or to making a development application under the *Integrated Planning Act 1997* for the construction of a road or services across the Easement Area.
- (c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's access or other rights under the Easement along or across the Easement Area.

## 7 SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

## 8 INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("Claims") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement;
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement; and
- (c) the exercise by the Coordinator-General and all parties authorised by clause 2.2 or any of their rights pursuant to the Easement.

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (d) caused; or
- (e) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution).

by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.

## 9 SURRENDER OF EASEMENT

In the event that the Easement is no longer required in terms of the Project as a consequence of changed circumstances and/or the Infrastructure is no longer used,

then the Coordinator-General must remove the Infrastructure and surrender the Easement.

## SCHEDULE 8

### State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971 Rights and Obligations Under Easement

#### 1 INTERPRETATION

##### 1.1 In this Schedule:

**"Burdened Land"** means the land over which the Easement is taken.

**"Coordinator-General"** means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, and, where applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

**"Easement"** means the easement taken by the Coordinator-General including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

**"Easement Area"** means that portion of the Burdened Land over which the Easement is obtained.

**"Infrastructure"** means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced.

**"Landowner"** means the person who is a registered owner of the Burdened Land from time to time.

“**Project**” means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:

- (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
- (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement may be registered as a public utility easement.

## 2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) control or removal in relation to the Easement Area from time to time;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the

other things that the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;

- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (h) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General’s opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General’s rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
  - (1) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
  - (2) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
  - (3) temporarily restricting access to the Easement Area or parts of it, by whatever means the Coordinator-General thinks fit including fencing off the Easement Area or parts of it, and doing other things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (1) or soil referred to in subparagraph (2).

2.2 The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other

parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, the Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement must:

- (a) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly;
- (b) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (c) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area; and
- (d) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational, health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches the Easement, the Coordinator-General may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement). Any action in rectifying such breach shall be taken without the Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner.

### **3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER**

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) not erect or permit to be erected any improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) maintain and repair, and not change, any existing improvement, building,

structure, pipeline, services, road, fence, driveway or paving on or through the Easement Area (other than the Infrastructure);

- (c) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not plant trees on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (e) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (f) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (g) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that the Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause a nuisance that adversely affects the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement or any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time, but if any nuisance is caused, then promptly abate such nuisance;
- (i) use the Landowner's best endeavours to prevent anyone else doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to do any of those things;
- (j) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement; and



- (k) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of the Coordinator-General's rights and powers under the Easement.

## 4 OTHER MATTERS

### 4.1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

### 4.2 Fences

If the Coordinator-General pulls down or breaks open any fencing under the Easement:

- (a) the Coordinator-General may either repair the fencing it has pulled down or broken open or install a gate in place of that fencing to at least a standard reasonably equivalent to that of the fencing before it was pulled down or broken open;
- (b) the owner of the fencing that was pulled down or broken open will become the owner of the repaired fencing or gate; and
- (c) that owner must maintain the repaired fencing or gate.

### 4.3 Stamping and registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

### 4.5 Mining or petroleum tenement

The Landowner is to use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the

*Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

### 4.6 Further assurances

The Landowner will execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

## 5 NOTICE

### 5.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

### 5.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

**6 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S

    - (B) the Landowner supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to the Coordinator-General.
- (c) It will be reasonable for the Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the Landowner are, in the Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict the Coordinator-General's access or other rights under the Easement along or across the Easement Area.

**7 SEVERABILITY**

- (a) Subject to clause 7(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 7(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

**8 INDEMNITY FOR LANDOWNER**

The Coordinator-General indemnifies the Landowner including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses, excluding any indirect or consequential loss ("Claims") arising from:

- (a) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; and
- (b) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the exercise of its rights under the Easement;

except to the extent that any Claims are:

- (c) caused; or
- (d) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),

by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.

**SCHEDULE 9**

**State Development and Public Works  
Organisation Act 1971  
Rights and Obligations Under  
Easement**

**1 INTERPRETATION**

- 1.1 In this Schedule:

**Approval** means any licence, permit, consent, approval, determination, certificate or permission from any governmental authority or under any Law or requirement made under any Law.

**BAPF Pipeline** means the Brisbane Airport Pipeline Facility.

**Burdened Land** means the land over which the Easement is taken.

**Contamination** means a discharge, emission or deposit of any solid, liquid, gas or substance of any kind that brings about a detrimental change in the condition of the Environment and that makes or may make the Environment unsafe, unfit or harmful for habitation, use or occupation by any person or animal or is such that any part of the Environment does not satisfy the contamination criteria or standards published or adopted from time to time by the Governmental Agency responsible for Hazardous Substances, environmental protection and Contamination matters in Queensland.

**Coordinator-General** means the Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of the Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by the Coordinator-General to exercise the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, and where, applicable, means the assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.

**DGSM Act** means the *Dangerous Goods Safety Management Act 2001* (Qld) as amended from time to time and any regulations made pursuant to that Act.

**Easement** means this schedule and the Form 9 to which this schedule is attached.

**Easement Area** means that portion of the Burdened Land identified in Item 2 of the Form 9 in this Easement.

**Environment** includes:

- (a) the meaning given at common law;
- (b) the meaning given in any legislation in force in Queensland; and

- (c) any land, water, atmosphere, climate, sound, odour, taste, the biological factors of animals and plants and the social factors of aesthetics.

**Environmental Law** means any law relating to the Environment including any law relating to land use, planning, pollution of air, water, soil or groundwater, chemicals, waste, the use of transport, the storage or handling of dangerous goods, the health or safety of any person or Hazardous Substances, or any other matters relating to the protection of the Environment, health or property.

**Equipment** means equipment which is reasonably necessary to be taken onto the Easement Area by the Coordinator-General for a purpose in connection with this Easement.

**Excavation** means any activity which breaks open or disturbs the soil of the Easement Area to an extent that would or would be likely to cause any damage to, or compromise the integrity of, the Pipeline.

**Governmental Agency** means a government or a governmental, semi-governmental or judicial entity or authority.

**Hazardous Substance** means any substance that would or might reasonably be expected to cause injury to any person or the Environment including those substances included or defined as hazardous or dangerous under any Law in Queensland.

**Infrastructure** means infrastructure of any kind required for and/or incidental to the Project and without limitation includes infrastructure relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including, for example, goods, material, substances, matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced and includes the *Pipeline*.

**Landowner** means the person who is a registered owner or, if the Burdened Land is State Leasehold land, the registered lessee of the Burdened Land from time to time.

**Law** means:

- (a) statutes, regulations, by-laws and other subordinate regulations of the Commonwealth, a state or territory or Governmental Agency and common law; and
- (b) binding requirements and Approvals (including any conditions or requirements under them).

**Major Hazard Facility** has the meaning given in the *Dangerous Goods Safety Management Act 2001 (Qld)*.

**Non-State Entity** means an entity other than the Coordinator-General, any State government authority, statutory body, crown instrumentality, Water Entity or government owned corporation or company established under the *Corporations Act 2001* that the State owns or controls, which receives more than 50% of its annual income from the State.

**Pipeline** means 2 underground recycled water pipelines and includes their associated structures, infrastructure, materials and related equipment.

**Public Risk Insurance** means a public risk policy in the sum of \$20 million for any one occurrence or such greater amount as a prudent provider of significant public utilities infrastructure would have in place from time to time.

**Project** means the Western Corridor Recycled Water Scheme as referred to in the *Water Regulation 2002*.

**Services** means water, gas, electricity, sewerage, telecommunications and similar services and any plant, equipment or infrastructure installed or located on or in the Burdened Land in connection with those services.

**State Entity** means the Coordinator-General, any State government authority, statutory body, crown instrumentality, Water Entity or government owned corporation or company established under the *Corporations Act 2001* that the State owns or controls, which receives more than 50% of its annual income from the State.

**Water Entity** means a water entity as defined under s.65 of the *South East*

*Queensland Water (Restructuring) Act 2007 (Qld)*.

**WHS Act** means the *Workplace Health and Safety Act 1995 (Qld)* as amended from time to time and any regulations made pursuant to that Act.

**Work Method Statement** has the meaning given in clause 4.4 or clause 7.1(b)(ii) for the Coordinator-General and Landowner respectively.

**Work** means any work carried out on the Easement Area by or on behalf of the Coordinator-General including, without limitation:

- (a) work associated with the operation, maintenance or repair of the Infrastructure;
- (b) work associated with upgrading or replacing the Infrastructure;
- (c) work associated with the testing and inspection of the Infrastructure; and
- (d) preparatory works,

which involves breaking open the soil of the Easement Area (both the surface and sub-surface) or erecting, altering or replacing fencing, barriers or other structures on the Easement Area or the Infrastructure.

- 1.2 If the Landowner or the party having the benefit of the Easement consists of two or more persons at any time:
  - (a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and
  - (b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.
- 1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.
- 1.4 The Easement is intended to burden the land described in Schedule 1 and in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and the process set out in section 6(2) of

the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*. The Coordinator-General is a public utility provider under the *Land Title Act 1994* and the *Land Act 1994*. The Easement will be registered as a public utility easement.

1.5 In this Schedule unless the context requires otherwise:

- (a) the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
- (b) a reference to one gender includes a reference to all other genders;
- (c) headings to clauses are included for the sake of convenience only and will not affect the interpretation of the clauses to which they relate; and
- (d) references to any statute or statutory provision include that statute or statutory provision as amended, extended, consolidated or replaced by subsequent legislation and any orders, regulations, instruments or other subordinate legislation made under the relevant statute.

## **2. RIGHTS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL**

### **2.1 Use of the Easement Area by the Coordinator-General**

Subject to the terms and conditions of the Easement, the Coordinator-General may:

- (a) install, repair, maintain, remove, replace, clean, clear, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, or through the Easement Area from time to time;
- (b) inspect or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it, from time to time;
- (c) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (d) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is reasonably necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of

the things the Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;

- (e) take Equipment onto the Easement Area and use and operate that Equipment; and
- (f) do on the Easement Area anything which in the Coordinator-General's opinion is reasonably necessary or convenient for, or incidental to, exercising the Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
  - (i) stockpiling Infrastructure or items required for or relating to the installation, repair, maintenance, removal, replacement, cleaning, clearing, addition or alteration of Infrastructure;
  - (ii) stockpiling soil dug up on or from under the Easement Area; and
  - (iii) doing things to provide for the security of Infrastructure or persons or livestock, items referred to in subparagraph (i) or soil referred to in subparagraph (ii).

### **2.2 Use of Easement Area by other parties**

- (a) The Coordinator-General shall have the right to authorise, permit or license other parties to use the Easement Area for all or any of the purposes as the Coordinator-General may do so under the Easement, and otherwise to exercise the same rights and powers as the Coordinator-General under the Easement subject to all the conditions and restrictions upon such rights as are set out in the Easement.
- (b) Except in the case of an emergency, the Coordinator-General must give not less than 2 days' prior notice to the Landowner of any other party authorised, permitted or licensed by the Coordinator-General under clause 2.2(a).

### 3. ACCESS TO EASEMENT AREA

#### 3.1 Requirements for Access to Easement Area

- (a) Subject to clause 3.2, before accessing the Easement Area for a purpose in connection with this Easement, the Coordinator-General must provide reasonable notice to the Landowner.
- (b) If reasonably required by the Landowner, the Coordinator-General must be accompanied by an authorised representative of the Landowner when accessing the Easement Area.

#### 3.2 Emergency Access

In the case of an emergency:

- (a) the requirements of clause 3.1 will not apply; and
- (b) the Coordinator-General must use reasonable endeavours to give the Landowner prior notice before accessing the Easement Area.

#### 3.3 Requirements for Access to Burdened Land

- (a) General obligation

The Coordinator-General must:

- (i) ensure that when accessing the Easement Area:
  - (A) it engages in no act or makes any omission that puts either the Coordinator-General or the Landowner in breach of any Law in respect of workplace health and safety and hazard management, including but not limited to the WHS Act and DGSM Act; and
  - (B) its employees, consultants or contractors comply with the requirements referred to in this clause 3.3; and
- (ii) subject to any privacy or confidentiality obligations that the Coordinator-General has,

keep the Landowner and, if directed by the Landowner, any other party identified by the Landowner, fully informed of all workplace health and safety and hazard management matters arising out of or in any way connected with access to the Easement Area as soon as they occur.

- (b) WHS Act obligations

- (i) For the purposes of the WHS Act, the Coordinator-General is (or shall appoint a duly qualified person ("Nominee")) the 'principal contractor' for the period during which the Coordinator-General accesses the Easement Area for the purpose of carrying out Works.

- (ii) For the period that the Coordinator-General accesses the Easement Area for the purpose of carrying out Works, the Coordinator-General:

- (A) accepts (or undertakes to ensure its Nominee accepts) its appointment as 'principal contractor' and shall do all acts necessary to effect the appointment under clause 3.3(b)(i);

- (B) will provide evidence of the appointment as 'principal contractor' to the Landowner within 14 days of notification of the appointment;

- (C) accepts responsibility for compliance with all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (including the WHS Act) in respect of access to the Easement Area;

- (D) shall attend to all applicable lodgements required and pay all fees, fines and other amounts becoming payable under

- or in connection with all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (including the WHS Act) in respect of its access to the Easement Area;
- (E) must comply with the duties of a 'principal contractor' under the WHS Act in respect of its access to the Easement Area (regardless of whether any access to the Easement Area is granted to any person) including:
- (1) having a corporate workplace health and safety and rehabilitation management system in place which is in accordance with the most current Queensland Government requirements;
  - (2) ensuring that any workplace health and safety plans include safety procedures to ensure compliance with the obligation of a 'principal contractor' under the WHS Act;
  - (3) carrying out all works in the Easement Area in a safe manner; and
  - (4) identifying any land or improvements which may be affected by access to the Easement Area;
- (F) without limiting its obligations under this Easement, shall carry out all risk assessments as and when required by all workplace health and safety legislative requirements (and, in any event, by no later than a reasonable time prior to carrying out any work in the Easement Area the subject of the relevant risk assessment);
- (G) must provide a copy of each risk assessment referred to in clause 3.3(b)(ii)(F) above (and updates of such risk assessments) to the Landowner's representative;
- (H) must, (and must ensure its consultants and contractors), reasonably consult with the Landowner, any person nominated by the Landowner and any person required under the WHS Act in relation to how access to and work on the Easement Area can be undertaken in a way which prevents or minimises all risks to health and safety of all persons including identifying potential associated hazards.
- (c) DGSM Act obligations
- For the purpose of the DGSM Act, the Coordinator-General:
- (i) accepts responsibility for ensuring compliance with the DGSM Act in respect access to the Easement Area and work performed on the Easement Area; and
  - (ii) will, when reasonably directed by the Landowner, provide such assistance as is reasonably necessary, including the provision of any information or documents, to assist the Landowner to comply with its

obligations under the DGSM Act.

#### **4. CONSTRUCTION WORKS**

##### **4.1 Prior notice for Works**

- (a) Except in the case of an emergency, before commencing Works on the Easement Area, the Coordinator-General must give the Landowner reasonable prior notice of:
  - (i) the nature of the Works to be carried out;
  - (ii) the proposed timing for the Works; and
  - (iii) whether the Works be likely to involve any restriction of access to the Burdened Land or be carried out in the vicinity of the car parking areas on the Easement Area or the Burdened Land.
- (b) In the case of an emergency, the notice required by clause 4.1(a) must be given by the Coordinator-General as soon as reasonably practicable.
- (c) The Coordinator-General acknowledges and agrees that:
  - (i) it will be wholly responsible for all Works carried out in the Easement Area by or on behalf of the Coordinator-General; and
  - (ii) by giving its consent to, or imposing conditions on, the carrying out of the Works, the Landowner is not assuming any responsibility whatsoever for the Works.

##### **4.2 Excavation Works**

Except in the case of an emergency and without limiting clause 4.1(a), the Coordinator-General must

- (a) give the Landowner not less than 2 days' prior notice of its intention to excavate any part of the Easement Area in which the Services or the BAPF Pipeline exist; and
- (b) upon reasonable request permit the Landowner to:

- (i) inspect the excavation works; and
- (ii) to the extent that it will not pose a material risk to the Pipeline or materially prejudice the carrying out of the Works or the exercise by the Coordinator-General of its rights under this Easement, undertake its own works or testing in connection with the BAPF Pipeline or the Services before the excavation works are refilled.

##### **4.3 Work Method Statement**

Except in the case of an emergency, before commencing Works on the Easement Area the Coordinator-General must prepare a Work Method Statement (which must be updated from time to time as reasonably required during the performance of the Works) to the Landowner's reasonable satisfaction which addresses the following in respect of the Works:

- (a) safe practices and procedures for carrying out the Works (including, without limitation, practices and procedures relevant to the Major Hazard Facility (if relevant));
- (b) actions to be taken to minimise the risk of harm being caused to the Environment by the Works;
- (c) actions to be taken to maintain the security of the Land and minimise interference with the Landowner's business operations on the Land; and
- (d) the workplace health and safety responsibilities in respect of the Works.

##### **4.4 Approvals and Laws**

- (a) The Coordinator-General must ensure that all Approvals required for the Works (including Approvals from the owners of the Services) are obtained before the Works commence.
- (b) All Works carried out by the Coordinator-General on the Easement Area must be carried out in accordance with:



- (i) the requirements of the Work Method Statement as updated from time to time in accordance with clause 4.3;
- (ii) the reasonable requirements of the Landowner in relation to the use and availability of the existing access ways and car parking areas on the Easement Area;
- (iii) any relevant Approvals (including Approvals from the owners of the Services); and
- (iv) all Laws including, without limitation:
  - (A) Environmental Laws; and
  - (B) Laws relating to occupational health and safety.

#### 4.5 Obligation to Minimise Interference

In accessing the Easement Area or carrying out Works, the Coordinator-General must take all action reasonably necessary to minimise:

- (a) damage to the Easement Area and the Burdened Land;
- (b) damage to the property of the Landowner or to that of its employees, servants, agents, tenants, licensees, visitors or invitees;
- (c) interference with the Services on the Easement Area or Burdened Land; and
- (d) disruption to or interference with the Landowner's business operations, its employees, servants, agents, tenants, licensees, visitors, invitees or others using or present on the Burdened Land.

#### 4.6 Make-Good Obligations

If the Coordinator-General causes damage to the Easement Area or the Burdened Land in carrying out Works or otherwise, the Coordinator-General must promptly reinstate, repair and make good the Easement Area and/or the Burdened Land to the Landowner's reasonable satisfaction so as to return the Easement Area and/or the Burdened Land to the same state of

repair that it was in (but having regard to the Works so undertaken) immediately before the damage occurred.

### 5. BAPF Pipeline

#### 5.1 Operation of Clause 5

This clause will operate only for the period that the BAPF Pipeline exists and continues to exist within the Easement Area.

#### 5.2 Coordinator-General's Obligation

The Coordinator-General must do everything reasonably necessary to prevent interference with or damage to the BAPF Pipeline by the Infrastructure or Coordinator-General's use of the Easement Area, including, but not limited to:

- (a) carrying out regular monitoring, testing and inspection of the Infrastructure ("Test"); and
- (b) ensuring appropriate cathodic protection of the Infrastructure is maintained at all times and upgraded where necessary in accordance with applicable industry standards.

A copy of the results of each Test must be provided to the Landowner within a reasonable time after the results are available.

#### 5.3 Notification by Landowner

If the Landowner:

- (a) notifies the Coordinator-General that the Test results or the results of its testing, monitoring or inspection of the BAPF Pipeline indicate that the BAPF Pipeline is being detrimentally impacted by the Infrastructure; and
- (b) provides the Coordinator-General with reasonable independent evidence in support of that detrimental impact,

then the Coordinator-General must promptly upgrade the cathodic protection of the Infrastructure to meet the appropriate industry standards.

### 6. OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

- 6.1 Subject to the Landowner's rights under clause 7, the Landowner must:

- (a) not alter the ground level of the Easement Area or change its topography or do anything to cause inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (b) not plant trees on the Easement Area which are likely to interfere with the Infrastructure without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (c) not crop, dig or plough the Easement Area or cause the lighting of fires on or adjacent the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (d) not erect improvements, buildings, structures, pipelines, Services, roads, fences, driveways or paving on or under the Easement Area without the consent of the Coordinator-General (such consent not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed);
- (e) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (f) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time without the prior written consent of the Coordinator-General;
- (g) use reasonable endeavours to prevent anyone else under the Landowner's control doing any of the things that the Landowner is required not to do under the Easement and not allow or authorise anyone else to any of those things; and
- (h) not interfere with or obstruct the Coordinator-General in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under the Easement except in accordance with the Landowner's rights under this Easement.

## 7. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

### 7.1 Existing Improvements, Upkeep and Environmental Obligations

- (a) Subject to clause 7.1(b), the Landowner may:

- (i) repair and maintain any existing improvement, road, fence, driveway or paving on the Easement Area;
- (ii) carry out works on the Easement Area to upkeep the Easement Area to the Landowner's satisfaction including, without limitation, mowing, slashing or pruning vegetation, gardening and landscaping works; and
- (iii) subject to clause 8.2, carry out any works on the Easement Area necessary to comply with the Landowner's obligations under a Law (including an Environmental Law) or the Landowner's environmental policies and procedures for the Burdened Land including, without limitation, works necessary to remediate Contamination or test for the presence of Contamination on the Burdened Land or in the groundwater,

**(Landowner's Works)** without the consent of the Coordinator-General provided that it takes all reasonable steps necessary to minimise interference with the safety, security or operation of the Infrastructure.

- (b) Except in the case of an emergency, where the Landowner's Works involve any Excavation or other activity that would pose a material risk to the integrity or safety of the Pipeline within the Easement Area the Landowner must:
  - (i) give the Coordinator-General reasonable prior notice of:
    - (A) the nature of the Landowner's Works to be carried out;
    - (B) the proposed timing for the Landowner's Works; and
    - (C) whether the Landowner's Works be likely to

involve any restriction of access to the Easement Area; and

- (ii) prepare a Work Method Statement (which must be updated from time to time as reasonably required during the performance of the Landowner's Works) to the Coordinator-General's (or its nominee's) reasonable satisfaction which addresses the following in respect of the Works:
  - (A) safe practices and procedures for carrying out the Landowner's Works;
  - (B) actions to be taken to minimise the risk of harm being caused to the Pipeline by the Landowner's Works;
  - (C) actions to be taken to minimise interference with the Coordinator-General's exercise and enjoyment of its rights under this Easement; and
  - (D) the workplace health and safety responsibilities in respect of the Landowner's Works.
- (iii) carry out the Landowner's Works in accordance with the requirements of that Work Method Statement.

## OTHER MATTERS

### 1 Ownership of Infrastructure

All Infrastructure and other things brought onto or installed on, in or through the Easement Area from time to time by the Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and the Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of the Coordinator-General (unless otherwise assigned).

### 8.2 Fencing

- (a) The Landowner must not erect or maintain any fencing preventing access to or within the Easement Area, unless:
  - (i) the fencing includes a lockable gate of suitable size to permit entry for maintenance vehicles to the Easement Area in a location agreed with the Coordinator-General (acting reasonably); and
  - (ii) a set of keys to the lockable gate referred to in clause 8.2(a)(i) are provided to the Coordinator-General.
- (b) The Coordinator-General must reimburse the Landowner all reasonable costs incurred by the Landowner in erecting the lockable gate pursuant to this clause.

### 8.3 Stamping and Registering of Easement

The Coordinator-General must stamp (if required) and register the Easement and pay all duty and registration fees on the Easement.

### 8.4 Mining or Petroleum Tenement

The Landowner will use their best endeavours to give the Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within a reasonable time after the Landowner receives such notification.

### 8.5 Further Assurances

- (a) The Landowner will, at the cost of the Coordinator-General, execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of the Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as the Coordinator-General may reasonably

require, including producing the title document for the Easement Area and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by the Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

- (b) The Coordinator-General must, at its cost, obtain the consent of any person necessary for the registration of the Easement (including, without limitation, the consent of the Minister for Natural Resources and Water to the Easement).

## 9. NOTICE

### 9.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and may be signed by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

### 9.2 How to Give a Communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

### 9.3 Particulars for Delivery of Notices

The address and facsimile number of the Coordinator-General and Landowner is that specified below or that which a party specifies by written notice to the other party from time to time:

#### **Landowner:**

The address and facsimile notified to the Coordinator-General and in the absence of such notice, the address shall be the land of which the Burdened Land forms part.

## 10. CONSENT

Where the consent of a party is required under this Easement, that consent must not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

## 11. SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 11(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 11(a), does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial of financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.

## 12. INDEMNITY, RISK AND INSURANCE

### 12.1 Risk

The Coordinator-General accesses the Burdened Land and the Easement Area and carries out all Works at its own risk.

### 12.2 Indemnity

- (a) The Coordinator-General releases, indemnifies and keeps indemnified the Landowner (and each of its employees, officers, agents and contractors) including any successors in title to the Burdened Land, from and against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, claims, losses, damages, costs and expenses (excluding any indirect or consequential loss) ("Claims") arising from:
  - (i) any breach by the Coordinator-General of the terms of the Easement; or
  - (ii) any act or omission of the Coordinator-General in the

- exercise of its rights under the Easement,
- except to the extent that any Claims are:
- (iii) caused; or
  - (iv) contributed to (but only to the extent of that contribution),
- by the act or omission of the Landowner or its employees, officers, agents or contractors.
- (b) Despite anything to the contrary in this Deed, nothing in this clause 12 limits any right of the Landowner at general law.
  - (c) To avoid doubt, the references to 'Coordinator-General' in clauses 12.2(a)(i) and 12.2(a)(ii) include, without limitation, persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by the Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area for the purposes of the Easement.

### 12.3 Insurance

- (a) Where the holder of the benefit of this Easement (the **Easement Holder**) is a Non-State Entity, the Easement Holder must:
  - (i) effect and maintain at all times Public Risk Insurance in respect of liability arising in relation to or in connection with the Easement Area, the Infrastructure and the Easement Holder's activities on, over or under the Easement Area; and
  - (ii) effect workers compensation insurance required by law in respect of Works and maintain such insurance for the entire period that the Easement Holder accesses the Easement Area in connection with the Works,
- (b) All policies of insurance effected by the Easement Holder pursuant to this clause 12.3 must:

- (i) save for workers compensation insurance, cover the Landowner as an insured party;
  - (ii) cover the liability of the Easement Holder to the Landowner and to third parties for loss or damage to property and the death of or injury to any person caused by the Works; and
  - (iii) be with an insurer and on terms acceptable to the Landowner, acting reasonably, and which are reasonably available in the insurance market.
- (c) Where a State Entity (other than the Coordinator-General) is the Easement Holder:
    - (i) the Easement Holder must effect and maintain insurance on the same terms and for at least the same coverage as required by clause 12.3; and
    - (ii) the Landowner acknowledges and agrees that such insurance may be effected with the Queensland Government Insurance Fund.
  - (d) Notwithstanding the definition of Coordinator-General in clause 1.1, the reference to Coordinator-General in clause 12.3(c) does not include an assignee or transferee of the Coordinator-General.
  - (e) The Easement Holder must provide the Landowner with evidence of its compliance with this clause 12.3 upon request.

**Short Title**

1. This Notice may be cited as the *Integrated Resort Development (Approval of Amendment) Notice (No. 1) 2009*

**Commencement**

2. This Notice commences on 17 July 2009.

**Definition**

3. In this Notice –

“Hope Island Resort Approved Scheme of Development” means the approved scheme as notified by Order in Council published in the gazette on 15 February 1992 as amended.

**Amendment of Approved Scheme of Development**
