**NOTICE OF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY LOCAL PLANNING
INSTRUMENT No. 1 of 2023 –
COLMSLIE ROAD INDUSTRY PRECINCT (TLPI 01/2023)**

BRISBANE CITY COUNCIL LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA

I, the Honourable Steven Miles MP, Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure, Local Government and Planning and Minister Assisting the Premier on Olympic and Paralympic Games Infrastructure, notify that I have made TLPI 01/2023 in accordance with section 27(3) of the *Planning Act 2016* and the Minister's Guidelines and Rules September 2020. The effective day for TLPI 01/2023 will be 30 June 2023 and TLPI 01/2023 will have effect for a period of two years after the effective day unless repealed sooner.

Purpose and general effect

TLPI 01/2023 is a temporary local planning instrument under section 23 of the *Planning Act 2016*. Under section 23(3) of the *Planning Act 2016*, a temporary local planning instrument may suspend or otherwise affect the operation of another local planning instrument but does not amend or repeal the instrument.

The purpose of TLPI 01/2023 is to:

- continue to protect the integrity of land in an Industry zone within the Colmslie Road Industry Precinct (CRIP) for new and existing industry uses and enable new investment in industry to occur within the CRIP to provide economic benefits to the region and local area
- ensure incompatible non-industrial uses do not undermine the viability of, and continued and future operation of, established and envisaged industrial development
- protect the effective operation of established and envisaged industrial uses by avoiding encroachment by incompatible non-industrial development that may generate reverse amenity or transport impacts
- improve the capacity, operating and safety performance of the transport network to support traffic and transport movements generated by new development
- ensure development enables safe and efficient access to the CRIP, including public passenger transport infrastructure and active transport infrastructure.

Location of area to which TLPI 01/2023 applies

TLPI 01/2023 applies only to part of the Brisbane City Council local government area, namely the land within the CRIP identified in Figure 1 of the TLPI.

TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE BY THE MINISTER (No 02) 2023

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice by the Minister (No 02) 2023*.

Easement taken [ss.6 and 9(7) of the Act]

2. The easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Northern SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority trading as Unitywater for sewerage purposes and vests in Northern SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority trading as Unitywater on and from 30 June 2023.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Definitions

In this Easement unless the context or subject matter require otherwise:

- (a) **Easement Land** means that part of the land over which this easement is taken;
- (b) **Matter** means buildings, structures or other materials or things erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement Land and includes trees and plants within the Easement Land;
- (c) **Owner** means any person who has an estate, interest, right, power or privilege in, over, or in relation the land subject to the Easement Land and that person's administrators, assignees and successors;
- (d) **Relevant Works** means:
 - (i) where the purpose of this Easement is "Sewerage": sewer(s) and/or pipeline(s) for the purpose of conveying sewerage and all kinds of waste through, across or under the Easement Land together with manholes, stopcocks and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments (including pumps and/or pump stations where required) as well as works for the protection and/or support of such things; and
 - (ii) where the purpose of this Easement is "Water Supply": water reticulation mains and/or pipelines for the purpose of conveying water supplied by Unitywater through, across or under the Easement Land together with manholes, stopcocks, meters, pressure control devices, pumps and/or pump stations, water reservoirs and all other usual or necessary fittings and attachments as well as works for the protection and/or support of all such things; and

(e) **Unitywater** means:

- (i) the Northern SEQ Distributor-Retailer Authority (trading as Unitywater) established under section 8 of the *South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) Act 2009* and its assignees and successors; and
- (ii) if the context permits, Authorised Persons.

1.2 Interpretation

In this Easement:

- (a) a reference to a statute includes Orders in Council, Proclamations, Regulations, Rules, Local Laws and Ordinances made under the statute and any statute amending, consolidating or replacing the statute;
- (b) headings have been included for ease of reference and guidance and this Easement is to be construed without reference to them;
- (c) the singular number includes the plural and vice versa;
- (d) words importing an masculine gender includes all other genders;
- (e) words importing persons include companies and corporations and vice versa;
- (f) If a covenant contained in this Easement is or becomes invalid or unenforceable, the remaining covenants contained in this Easement remain in full force and effect; and
- (g) if a party to this Easement comprises 2 or more legal entities, the covenants contained in this Easement bind each of them jointly and severally.

2. RIGHTS OF UNITYWATER

2.1 Access

Where the purpose of this Easement includes Access, the following will apply:

The Owner grants to Unitywater the full and free right and liberty at all times, after the date of this Easement, to enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement Land at will and as often as the occasion requires, with employees, agents and contractors and other persons authorised by Unitywater and with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever.

2.2 Sewerage or Water Supply or Both

Where the purpose of this Easement includes Sewerage or Water Supply or both the following will apply:

The Owner grants Unitywater the full and free right and liberty at all times, after the date of this Easement, to enter upon the Easement Land for the purposes of constructing and thereafter forever using and maintaining the Relevant Works as it shall from time to time think fit and in so doing, Unitywater by its employees, agents and other persons authorised by Unitywater has the right to:

- (a) construct, install, extend, deepen, widen, cleanse, add to, remove, inspect, maintain and repair the Relevant Works and when and where thought fit by Unitywater to remove and replace the Relevant Works with new Relevant Works (whether of a similar of those replaced;
- (b) to change the size and number of any pipes which form part of the Relevant Works;
- (c) dig into, sink shafts in, and erect scaffolding upon the Easement Land and to open and break up the soil of the Easement Land or any part of the Easement Land including its sub-surface;
- (d) remove and dispose of spoil created as a consequence of exercising its rights hereunder;
- (e) clear and keep clear the Easement Land by any means or method and to cut and remove timber, trees and undergrowth from the Easement Land and to burn off such timber, trees and undergrowth;
- (f) construct and maintain on the Easement Land such access tracks, gates and appurtenant works as it considers necessary;
- (g) enter upon and remain, pass and repass on and over the Easement Land for all or any of the purposes aforesaid with or without vehicles, plant and equipment of any description whatsoever;
- (h) enter and exit to and from the Easement Land over such part or parts of the Owner's land adjoining or adjacent to the Easement Land as Unitywater shall consider most convenient or necessary for the purpose of passing between the Easement Land and the most convenient point of entry to or exit from the Owner's land (whether adjoining a constructed road or not);
- (i) do such other works and things through, across, in or under the Easement Land as are incidental to the proper exercise of the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement; and
- (j) use such part or parts of the Owner's land immediately adjacent to or adjoining either side of the Easement Land as Unitywater considers reasonable or necessary for the proper exercise of the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement.

4. FENCING

4.1 Removal

For the purpose of gaining access to the Easement Land Unitywater may demolish or break open any fencing on or adjacent to the Easement Land. However, if livestock are contained within the fenced area, Unitywater must give reasonable notice to the Owner to enable the Owner to secure the livestock.

4.2 Reinstatement

Unitywater must either:

- (a) reinstate all fences (other than a fence erected in contravention of Clause 5) damaged by Unitywater in the exercise and performance of any of the rights and liberties granted to Unitywater under this Easement; or
- (b) if the fences are not reinstated, install a gate using materials and employing workmanship which is not less than the quality of the materials and workmanship in the existing fence. The gate installed pursuant to this subclause becomes the property of the owner of the fence in which the gate is installed and after installation shall be maintained by the owner.

5. NO STRUCTURES ON THE EASEMENT LAND

The Owner must consult with Unitywater and Unitywater agrees not to unreasonably withhold or delay its consent if the Owner intends to:

- (a) erect any buildings or structures (other than fences) upon the Easement Land or any part of it;
- (b) permit the Easement Land or any part of it to be used in such a way as to unreasonably obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by Unitywater;
- (c) install concrete, bitumen or other pavement or driveways (except residential driveways) on the Easement Land or gardens or landscaping involving concrete, brick or other permanent materials; or
- (d) remove or stockpile or permit the removal or stockpiling of any soil, sand, gravel or other substance or material on the Easement Land or construct any roads, dam walls or other earthworks on the Easement Land which would in any way obstruct or interfere with the Relevant Works and/or the proper and effective use of the Relevant Works by Unitywater.

6. DAMAGE TO STRUCTURES

(a) Unitywater acting reasonably at all times and complying with all relevant laws, will determine how and in what manner the rights granted to Unitywater under this Easement are exercised. (b) Unitywater must not wilfully damage or destroy any Matter to any extent greater than is reasonably necessary in order to exercise its rights under this Easement but:

(i) Unitywater is not otherwise responsible for any damage to or destruction of any Matter in the course of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement; and

(ii) subject to Clause 4, Unitywater is not under any obligation to reinstate or repair any Matter damaged or destroyed in consequence of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement and its only obligation where such Matter has been so damaged or destroyed is to leave the Easement Land in as clean and tidy state as practicable having regard to the nature of the Matter which has been damaged or destroyed and the work which it has done; and

(iii) Unitywater is not in any event responsible for any inconvenience or disturbance to the Owner or occupiers of the Easement Land arising out of the exercise by Unitywater of its rights under this Easement.

7. REMOVAL OF UNAUTHORISED STRUCTURES

If a Matter is erected, placed, found or installed upon the Easement Land in contravention of Clause 5, Unitywater may, in addition to any other remedies and after having first given the Owner reasonable notice of its intention to invoke this clause, enter upon the Easement Land and remove or demolish the Matter and, if it does so:

(a) it may dispose of the Matter or any resultant demolition materials in such manner as it sees fit without being liable to account to the Owner therefore (except as provided in subclause (b) of this clause); and

(b) it may recover, in any Court of competent jurisdiction, costs actually incurred by it in taking that action (including internal wage and salary costs) less any moneys actually received by it as a result of disposing of the Matter or any resultant demolition materials.

8. PROTECTION OF RELEVANT WORKS

The Owner will not do any act or make any omission which will jeopardise or prejudicially affect the safety or reliable working of any Relevant Works.

9. RATES AND CHARGES

The Owner is responsible for all local authority rates and assessments and lawful charges in relation to the Easement Land.

10. FURTHER ASSURANCES

The benefit and burden of this Easement shall pass with and bind the Easement Land so as to enure to and bind all persons deriving title thereto from and under the Owner and Unitywater respectively and the Owner, whenever required by Unitywater or the person or persons for the time being entitled to the benefit of this Easement, must do all such things and give all such assurances as are reasonably required for the proper and effective carrying into effect of the rights conferred under this Easement but not so as to render the Owner liable to be called upon to contribute towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Relevant Works.

(No 03) 2023****Short title**

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice by the Minister (No 03) 2023*.

Easement taken [ss.6 and 9(7) of the Act]

2. The easement described in Schedule 2 is taken by Logan City Council for sewerage purposes and vests in Logan City Council on and from 30 June 2023.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by the easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

The Council holds an easement for the purposes, powers, rights and liberties set out below.

1. RIGHTS AND LIBERTIES

1.1 Subject to the terms of this document the Council has the full, free and uninterrupted right and liberty at all times of the day and the night and from time to time at the Council's pleasure:

- (a) to enter upon and traverse the Burdened Land for any purpose whatsoever connected with the Council's Drainage Powers and whether or not such entry or traversal is for the benefit or detriment of the Burdened Land and whether or not it is for the benefit of the Owner's Land or any neighbouring or other lands;
- (b) to carry out such works on the Burdened Land and do such things including, without limitation, digging, sinking shafts, erecting scaffolding, opening and breaking up the soil both surface and subsurface, placing and operating machinery and equipment, storing soil and gravel, laying Pipes, digging trenches and Drains and laying concrete on or within the Burdened Land as Council in its absolute discretion thinks necessary or desirable for any purpose whatsoever connected with Council's Drainage Powers and whether or not such works and things:
 - (i) are for the benefit or detriment of the Burdened Land; and
 - (ii) are for the benefit of the Owner's Land or any neighbouring or other lands; and
- (c) to permit the uninterrupted flow of Stormwater Drainage and whether flowing continuously, intermittently or occasionally, above or beneath the surface of the Burdened Land, and through or along the Drains or other means including, where applicable creeks, gullies or overland flow paths.

2. LIMITATION

2.1 The powers, rights and liberties contained in clause 1 shall in all respects be limited to:

- (a) the surveying, testing and excavating for the Drains or Pipes, the laying and constructing of the Drains or Pipes and thereafter forever maintaining the Drains or Pipes over, under or through the Burdened Land; and
- (b) the obtaining of free and uninterrupted access to any or any part of the Drains or Pipes from the surface of the Burdened Land for the purpose of laying, relaying, changing the size or number of, operating, inspecting, patrolling, altering, removing, replacing, constructing, reconstructing and repairing the Drains or Pipes.

3. COUNCIL'S AGENTS AND EQUIPMENT

3.1 The Council in exercising any of the powers, rights and liberties conferred by this document may do so by itself or by any one or more of Council's Agents.

3.2 The Council or the Council's Agents whether by themselves or in conjunction with others may exercise any one or more of the powers, rights and liberties conferred by this document on the Council and if necessary with vehicles,

machinery and equipment of any description whatsoever and if with such vehicles, machinery or equipment:

- (a) for such vehicles, machinery or equipment to be laden or unladen; and
- (b) for the continuous forward movements or three-point-turning movements of the vehicle.

4. OWNER NOT TO OBSTRUCT EASEMENT

4.1 The Owner shall not make, cause, allow or permit:

- (a) any obstruction, interruption, impeding, hampering or interference with, diversion, scouring, change or alteration in or to the flow of water or other matter, as the case may be, at any time;
- (b) any obstruction, interruption, impeding, or hampering of or interference with the powers, rights and liberties granted and conferred on the Council or Council's Agents by this document;
- (c) any ponding, storage, retention or deviation of water or other matter through or under the Burdened Land caused by or consequent upon:
 - (i) any use to which the Burdened Land is or might be put;
 - (ii) the erection, raising, making, placing of or suffering to stand or to remain any Structure, paving, vegetation (except grass which is kept properly mown at all times) or anything whatsoever upon the Burdened Land;
 - (iii) any alteration in level or gradient of the Burdened Land; or
 - (iv) any change to the surface of the Burdened Land or to the natural or artificial features of the Burdened Land which contain or assist in containing the flow of water or other matter on, under or through the Burdened Land; or
- (d) any obstruction, erection, making, placing of or allowing to stand any Structure of any kind on or within the Burdened Land, unless permitted in writing by Council or the Director and only to the extent permitted and upon such terms and conditions as Council or the Director imposes or stipulates in the event of such permission being granted.

4.2 Without limiting clause 4.1, the Owner must ensure that any works which are constructed on or in the Burdened Land do not obstruct, interfere with, damage or cause any change or alteration to any works constructed by Council within the Burdened Land.

4.3 Provided the Owner is not in breach of clause 4.1 and Council is not exercising its rights under clause 5, Council must either:

- (a) reinstate all fences damaged by it in the exercise of any of its rights granted under this document; or
- (b) in lieu of reinstating any such fence, install a gate the quality and materials of workmanship of which, except with the Owner's consent, must be not less than the quality and materials of workmanship of the existing fence. A gate so installed becomes the property of the Owner and thereafter must (subject to clause 4.3) be maintained by the Owner.

5. COUNCIL MAY REMEDY BREACH

5.1 If the Owner or any occupier of the Burdened Land or part of it breaches any part of clause 4, Council or Council's Agents may (without prejudice to any other remedy which Council might have) remedy such breach by:

- (a) demolishing, removing or otherwise disposing of any Structure, paving, vegetation or thing whatsoever;
- (b) performing any works or doing anything necessary for restoring, repairing or reinstating the Drains or Pipes and the Burdened Land (including re-grassing it) and reforming the natural or artificial features containing or assisting in containing the flow of water and other matter, as the case may be, above under or through the Burdened Land to their former state and condition;
- (c) altering, grading, paving, preparing, grassing and fertilising or mowing the surface of the Burdened Land

or placing, installing, establishing or constructing and keeping any earthworks and any other works whatsoever (whether of the class just mentioned or not) on or in the Burdened Land.

- 5.2 Should Council or Council's Agents exercise any of the rights, powers and remedies contained in clause 5.1, then the cost of exercising those rights, powers and remedies and the doing and performing of any works, making alterations, grading, paving, preparing, grassing, fertilising, mowing, demolishing, removing or disposing of any Structure, paving, vegetation or anything whatsoever shall be at the cost of the Owner of the Burdened Land.
- 5.3 The Owner confers on the Council and the Council's Agents all of the powers, rights and liberties mentioned in clauses 1 and 3 for the purpose of carrying out the rights, powers and remedies conferred on the Council by clause 5.1.

6. INDEMNITY

- 6.1 The Owner indemnifies Council and agrees at all times hereafter to keep it indemnified in respect of any claims, demands or actions which are made or brought against Council as a result of the installation, maintenance or use of the Drains or Pipes if such loss, damage, claim or action is in any way attributable to the negligence or deliberate act of the Owner, its servants, agents, employees, invitees or licensees or the occupiers of the Owner's Land.

7. OWNER TO MAINTAIN BURDENED LAND

- 7.1 Subject to clause 7:
- the Owner shall at all times maintain and keep the Burdened Land and the Owner's improvements on and in the Burdened Land (but, subject to clauses 7.1(b) and 7.1(c), excluding the Drains or Pipes) in good order and repair and in a clean and tidy condition;
 - if there are no such improvements or if the Drain is an open Drain (with or without embankments) the Owner undertakes to grass the Burdened Land and to keep it properly grassed and mown or otherwise appropriately vegetated to the reasonable satisfaction of Council; and
 - if Council constructs works or provides vegetation to minimise scouring or erosion within the Burdened Land then Council will maintain such works other than vegetation. The Owner shall maintain all vegetation in accordance with clause 7.1(b)

8. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 8.1 Notwithstanding any rule of law or equity all Drains, pipelines, Pipes, drips, valves, fittings, meters, connections and all other equipment and appurtenances brought onto, laid or installed upon or buried in or under the Burdened Land by Council at all times remain the property of Council notwithstanding that they are or might be annexed to the Burdened Land.
- 8.2 At any time and from time to time Council may remove all Drains, pipelines, Pipes, drips, valves, fittings, meters, connections and all other equipment and appurtenances brought onto, laid or installed upon or buried in or under the Burdened Land in whole or in part.
- 8.3 The Council, performing and observing the covenants and conditions to be observed and performed by it under this document, may peaceably hold and enjoy the rights, liberties, privileges and easement granted by this document without hindrance, molestation or interruption by the Owner or any person, firm or corporation.
- 8.4 If approval is given under the Planning Scheme for the Owner to grant another easement to a third party over the Burdened Land (Third Party Easement):
- any infrastructure which is installed pursuant to the Third Party Easement must be approved in writing by Council or the Director upon such terms and conditions as Council or the Director imposes or stipulates in the event of such permission being granted;
 - the rights and interests of the grantee under the Third Party Easement must not interfere with Council's rights and interests under this document; and

- in the event of any inconsistency between this document and the Third Party Easement, this document prevails.

9. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

9.1 Definitions

In this document unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires:

Burdened Land means the part of the Owner's Land subject to the Easement and includes the airspace above that land.

Council means Logan City Council and its successors, transferees and assigns.

Council's Agents includes the employees, agents, licensees, contractors, sub-contractors and professional consultants of Council.

Council's Drainage Powers includes the drainage powers given to Council by its Local Laws, the *Local Government Act 2009* (Qld), the *Planning Act*, the *Water Supply (Safety and Reliability) Act 2008* (Qld), the *South-East Queensland Water (Distribution and Retail Restructuring) Act 2009* (Qld) and the powers, rights and liberties conferred on Council by this document and any other relevant statute.

Director means the Director for the time being responsible for the delivery of Council's road and water infrastructure requirements.

Drain includes a drain (open or closed), Pipe, conduit or channel (including, if applicable any overland flow path) above or below ground level, with or without embankments, for the passage or conveyance of water or other matter and any manhole, manhole chamber, inlet, any equipment (whether mechanical or otherwise including water reservoirs) and any fittings or works in support of or in connection with it.

Easement means the easement over the Owner's Land in favour of Council, described on survey plan.

Owner means the registered owner of the Owner's Land and includes the respective transferees and assignees of the Owner and the registered owner or owners (and their and each of their respective successors, executors, administrators and assigns as the case may be) and the occupier or occupiers for the time being of the Burdened Land.

Owner's Land means the Lot burdened by the easement.

Pipe includes a pipe, Drain, conduit or channel above or below ground level for the passage or conveyance of water or other matter and any manholes, manhole chamber, surface box, inlet, valve, main, equipment (whether mechanical or otherwise) and fittings or works in support of or in connection with it.

Planning Scheme has the meaning given to that term in the *Planning Act 2016* (Qld) or its successor.

Stormwater Drainage means drainage of any kinds and, without limitation, includes rainwater, stormwater, liquid wastes and stormwater runoff and whether flowing individually or in concentration.

Structure includes buildings, fences and walls.

9.2 Interpretation

- In this document unless a contrary intention appears:
 - a clause is to a clause in this document;

- (d) Whenever more persons than one constitutes the Owner all the covenants, agreements, conditions, restrictions and provisos on the part of the Owner contained or implied in this document bind those persons jointly and each of them severally.

- (b) Council or Council's Agents whether by themselves or in conjunction with others may exercise any one or more of the powers, rights and liberties conferred on the Council by this document on Council and if necessary with vehicles, machinery and equipment of any description whatsoever.

5. OWNER NOT TO OBSTRUCT EASEMENT

The Owner must not at any time without the prior written consent of the Council:

- (a) execute or construct any excavations drains channels roads or other works of any kind in the Servient Tenement;
- (b) remove or interfere with any existing Council Works within the Servient Tenement;
- (c) erect any buildings or structures under, on or over the surface of the Servient Tenement or any part thereof;
- (d) install concrete, bitumen or other pavement or driveways in the Servient Tenement or gardens or landscaping of any kind;

- 5(2) Subject to section 91ZR of the Act and section 4 of this notice, the maximum fare levels described in Schedule B are to apply to metered taxis operating in regional Queensland, inclusive of all those taxi service areas not listed in subsection 5(1) of this notice.

- 5(3) In addition to the maximum fares specified in Schedule A and Schedule B of this notice:

- (a) where a hiring begins in a taxi service area and ends less than 40km outside the boundary of a taxi service area north of the Tropic of Capricorn, an additional charge of \$1.00 is payable for each kilometre from where the hiring ends to the boundary of the taxi service area nearest where the hiring ends by the shortest practicable way; and
