

## Appendix 2 – Definitions

### **Barrier of detection –**

method to restrain or restrict access to a corrective services facility and identify and prevent the introduction of a prohibited thing into a facility.

Points of detection include:

- (a) pedestrian entry;
- (b) vehicle entry;
- (c) commercial laundry loading dock;
- (d) reception store; and
- (e) gate house or duty office (low security facilities).

Refer standard operating procedure - Control of Access to a Corrective Services Facility

### **Corrective services facility** means –

- (a) a prison; or
- (b) a community corrections centre; or
- (c) a work camp.

### **Herbal cigarette** means –

a preparation for smoking that:

- (a) is made from a herb or other plant, or a blend of herbs or other plants, whether or not the herb, plant or blend is mixed with another substance; and
- (b) is enclosed in paper, bark, leaf or something else; and
- (c) does not contain tobacco.

### **Loose smoking blend** means –

a preparation for smoking that does not contain tobacco and is made from a herb or other plant, or a blend of herbs or other plants, and is prepared for retail sale, but does not include a herbal cigarette.

### **Prison** means –

a place declared to be a prison with the area declared to be a prison for each corrective services facility outlined in the *Corrective Services Regulations 2006*.

**Prohibited thing** means –

a thing prescribed under regulation to be a prohibited thing.

**Smoke** means –

smoke, hold or otherwise have control over an ignited smoking product.

**Smokeless tobacco product** means –

tobacco, or something containing tobacco, prepared for consumption other than by being smoked. *Examples*— snuff, chewing tobacco

**Smoking product** means –

- (a) a tobacco product, herbal cigarette, loose smoking blend or smoking related product; or
- (b) a package or carton of a thing mentioned in paragraph (a).

**Smoking related product** means –

a product, prescribed under a regulation, that is used primarily in the consumption of a tobacco product, herbal cigarette or loose smoking blend.

**Tobacco product** means –

tobacco prepared for consumption or something containing tobacco for consumption, and includes a cigarette, cigar and loose tobacco but does not include a smokeless tobacco product.

**Visitor** means –

any person, including a staff member and casual site visitor, who enters or intends to enter a corrective services facility.
