Promote the value of research for our health service and community

Align operational and research priorities to enhance patient outcomes

- Support each clinical division to establish appropriate oversight of research activities, priorities and pipelines.
- Build capability of health services and health systems research skills and activity, with a focus on emergent areas, such as health systems transformation and digital health.

Cultivate a culture of integration of research into clinical practice

- Continue the annual research showcase and research forums, and align content with the GCHHS Strategy and Research Roadmap pillars and strategy.
- Increase visibility and engagement in Research Grand Rounds, including active involvement of clinical leaders and academic partners.

Ensure consumers with diverse backgrounds are engaged in research design and research participation

- Develop a strategy to support consumers and researchers to strengthen research consumer engagement within the health service.
- Identify First Nations representation on research committees, including GCHHS HREC.
- Provide support (compensation and targeted orientation and education) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and CALD population participation in research projects as consumer advisors.

Commit to implementing research findings to improve clinical practice

- Develop a quarterly research newsletter including key publications, grants and research stories to be provided to the leadership and staff of GCHHS.
- Support greater visibility of GCHHS Research with the community and our partners.
- Ensure research is on the agenda of all executive committees.

Measure, document and disseminate the outcomes and impact of our research

- Continue to refine the meaningful collection and dissemination of information on research outputs and impacts.
- To further develop and promote the Research Expertise Directory to enable greater visibility of our research capabilities.
- Develop a communication plan, with a specific focus on identifying and modes of showcasing achievements in areas of strength/distinction.

Recognise and celebrate research successes

- Develop a quarterly research newsletter including key publications, grants and research stories to be provided to the leadership and staff of GCHHS.
- Provide weekly updates on research successes to the GCHHS CEO and the Executive Leadership Team through the ED-DTR.
- Continue the recognition of research achievements through the research and transformation awards.

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Advance our research infrastructure to evolve with the growth of research

Build research capabilities and essential skills within our workforce

- Curate an education program in collaboration with partners to support the professional development of early-and mid-career researchers with a focus on research design, biostatistics, critical appraisal, and research integrity.
- Identify and develop programs including active linkage with our academic partners to reduce commonly identified research skill gaps.

Create an operating model to ensure high quality and sustainable research

- Identify opportunities for standardisation, automation and other efficiencies in Research Office processes (ethics, governance, finance, monitoring).
- Develop a sustainable business plan and model that supports the growth of clinical trials and health research.
- Formalise the relationship between the Research Office, clinical operational lines (including divisional research positions) and health service finance leadership.

Ensure investment, including maximising revenue, to support the growth of research

- Develop a SERTA business plan, including opportunities to leverage revenue from industry including commercial ventures to reinvest in research.
- Develop a research income and investment strategy, including identifying new funding sources.
- Establish a pool of study coordinators and clinical trial coordinators who are permanently appointed and distributed across our clinical services.
