'Explaining group of same-issue motions'





Regulation changes

The BCCM regulations were remade on 29 September 2020 and will come into effect on 1 March 2021



Expiring

Motions about the same issue are combined into a 'motion with alternatives' prepared by the committee



Expiring

Example of motion with alternatives


Original motions:

That the body corporate engage ABC Pty Ltd at a cost of \$5,000 a year, on the terms set out in the attached draft agreement

That the body corporate engage XYZ Pty Ltd at a cost of \$500 a month, in accordance with the attached terms and conditions.

MOTION 1

That the body corporate engage a body corporate manager for a period of 1 year commencing on 1 February 2021.



ALTERNATIVE A: That the body corporate engage ABC Pty Ltd at a cost of \$5,000 a year, on the terms set out in the attached draft agreement



ALTERNATIVE B: That the body corporate engage XYZ Pty Ltd at a cost of \$500 a month, in accordance with the attached terms and conditions.





New

2 or more motions submitted proposing different ways of dealing with the same issue must be listed as 'original motions' together on the agenda of the general meeting as a 'group of same-issue motions'



Group of same-issue motions – flow chart

2 or more motions proposing alternative ways of dealing with the same issue are listed on the general meeting agenda under the title of 'group of same issue motions' A voter casts a vote for or against one or more of the original motions The votes are counted to see if each original motion passes. If a motion passes it becomes a 'qualifying motion'. If there is only 1 qualifying motion If there is more than 1 qualifying motion, count the votes this motion becomes the in favour of each motion body corporate's decision If a motion receives the highest number If 2 or more motions have the equal highest number of of votes in favour, it becomes the votes in favour, count the votes against each motion body corporate's decision If more than 1 motion has equal highest number of votes If a motion received the fewest number of votes against the motion, it becomes in favour and equal highest number of votes against, the the body corporate's decision decision is made by chance e.g. toss of a coin





Motion fails



Equal votes in favour *and* against, motion is decided by chance e.g. toss of a coin



Explanatory schedule

Must include the following:

- title of the group as shown on the agenda
- a list of each motion (the original motion) that is part of the group
- each original motion as it was submitted
- an explanatory note about each motion given by the original submitter of the motion not longer than 300 words
- an explanatory note about how to vote, how the votes are counted and decided.



Voting papers

The original motions must appear on the voting paper under the title of the group of same-issue motions and be presented in the following order:

- Motions requiring a resolution without dissent
- Motions requiring a special resolution
- Motions requiring a majority resolution
- Motions requiring an ordinary resolution



Other

The chairperson cannot rule an original motion as part of a group of same-issue motions out of order simply if another original motion is out of order

An original motion that is part of a group of same-issue motions cannot be amended at a general meeting

If more than 1 motion about the same issue is listed on the agenda or stated in a voting paper for a meeting, all motions about the issue are void (unless they are an original motion part of a group of same-issue motions)
