

Proposal type	Details
Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	The proposed amendment will provide that commissioners of the Crime and Corruption Commission (CCC) may be appointed for up to 7 years. This is a regulatory proposal for the internal management of the public sector. No regulatory impact analysis is required under the Better Regulation Policy.
Minor and machinery in nature	 The proposed amendments will: establish a framework for the CCC to enter agreements with corporations to serve notices by email clarify that a lawyer representing a person may nominate their email address for the purpose of receiving only a particular notice. These regulatory proposals are minor and machinery in nature. They update an electronic service scheme that already exists to streamline how it operates for the CCC and corporations. They do not result in a substantive change to regulatory policy or new impacts on business, government or the community.
