



# **Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year**

2024 nominations are now open and close midnight 12 March 2024.

This award recognises an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander student who is outstanding in all aspects of their training and demonstrates the importance of lifelong learning for themselves and their community.

### Eligibility criteria

You can nominate yourself or someone else, provided you have their consent.

To be eligible, nominees must:

- meet eligibility and nominate for one of the following individual award categories:
  - o Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year
  - o Bob Marshman Trainee of the Year
  - Vocational Student of the Year
  - School-based Apprentice or Trainee of the Year
- in the nomination:
  - select that you identify as being of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent and wish to also nominate for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year award
  - o complete one additional selection criterion.

#### Additional selection criterion

#### SECTION B | Criterion 4: Community engagement

You may wish to include information about:

- How are you connected with your community/extended family?
- How has the training impacted your community?
- What qualities do you have or activities have you been involved in that you feel would be useful in your role as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year?
- What are your achievements in areas other than study and work?
