

Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year

2024 nominations are now open and close midnight 12 March 2024.

The Harry Hauenschild Apprentice of the Year award is presented to an individual who is undertaking an apprenticeship and has been outstanding in all aspects of their training.

Eligibility criteria

You can nominate yourself or someone else, provided you have their consent.

To be eligible, nominees must:

- be a permanent resident of Australia
- have completed, or be due to complete, your training (i.e. completion date) in the period of 1 July 2023 to 30 June 2024 in a training course that leads to a nationally recognised outcome or qualification relevant to this award
- have a registered training contract with the Queensland Government's Department of Employment, Small Business and Training
- meet the [conditions of entry](#).

Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islanders nominees are also eligible for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year award. To nominate, start a nomination for this category or another eligible individual award category, then tick the boxes indicating you:

- are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent
- wish to also nominate for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student award.

Entrants will then be required to address one additional criterion on community engagement only.

How to enter

Nominations are submitted online via a nomination portal. Access is available from the QTA website during the nomination period only.

You'll have to set-up an account, then complete nomination sections and hit submit. You can edit your nomination right up to closing time, even after you submit.

Section A: Overview

The information in Section A will **not** be considered or used for judging purposes, but it may be used as your summary throughout the awards process.

Your summary

Provide a short overview covering a description of the qualification you are enrolled in, your registered training organisation, and employer and host employer (if applicable) as well as your reason for choosing the industry and training path.

(Limit: 300 words)

Section B: Selection criteria

Nominees will be judged against the following selection criteria:

- Criterion 1: Career and study achievements
- Criterion 2: Team and communication skills
- Criterion 3: Ability to be an ambassador for training in Australia
- Criterion 4: Other qualities and pursuits

Addressing the selection criteria

This information will be considered and used for shortlisting and judging purposes. In your nomination, you must present your information in a way that clearly addresses the selection criteria. Judging panels will be looking for evidence of how your training has contributed to your career and study plans, to the development of your skills and your achievements to date, as well as any way in which your training may have helped you to achieve other qualities and pursuits.

The selection criteria should be the focus of the nomination. In developing your nomination, you may wish to take into account the considerations listed under each criterion.

Note: Considerations are not additional selection criteria but are provided to clarify what may be relevant to include when writing a response for each criterion.

Criterion 1: Career and study achievements

Consider things such as:

- Why did you choose your course?
- How has it changed or impacted you?
- What have you gained from it?
- What have you been able to bring to your workplace?

(Limit: 400 words)

Criterion 2: Team and communication skills

Consider the skills you have developed through your training, such as:

- What have you been able to tell others, work mates, employers etc. about your training?
- What do you like about working in a team setting?
- What traits do you think are important to positively influence others?

(Limit: 400 words)

Criterion 3: Ability to be an ambassador for training in Australia

Tell us about:

- Provide examples where you have taken a leadership role inside or outside of work?
- What other activities have you been involved in where you have been a representative?
- How would you describe the quality of your training?

(Limit: 400 words)

Criterion 4: Other qualities and pursuits

You may wish to include information about:

- Have you had to address any challenges that have impacted your training?
- When have you been required to use initiative either in your training, your personal life or your workplace?
- What other qualities or activities do you feel would be useful in your role as Apprentice of the Year?
- What other community or industry involvement have you had?

(Limit: 400 words)

SECTION C: Attachments

Required:

- professional headshot
- 3-5 workplace or publicity photos, ensuring you have consent from everyone pictured ([learn more about photo requirements and access photography tips online](#))

Optional supporting material, such as:

- letters of support (e.g. a reference from your teacher, employer or customers) – recommended
- newspaper, newsletter or other articles
- photocopies of awards or certificates

Up to five (5) single A4 pages of optional supporting material of relevance may be provided. Excess optional items **will not** be passed onto judging panels for assessment.

Each attachment **must not exceed 10MB**. Accepted file types include JPG, JPEG, PNG, PDF, DOC, DOCX, XLS and XLSX. Multimedia items (e.g. YouTube videos) or discs will not be accepted.



What happens next?

- Nominations are shortlisted for phone or online interviews, with judging at regional and state levels.
- **July – Queensland Training Awards regional finals**, regional winners announced
- **September – Queensland Training Awards state final**, state winners announced
- **November – Australian Training Awards**, national winners announced.
