Automated integrated voice response (AIVR) system

The Automated Integrated Voice Response (AIVR) system has been upgraded to meet the new reporting requirements that will apply to commercial fisheries in Queensland from 1 September 2021.

AIVR is an automated phone system that allows commercial fishers to report and access information via a voice response and touch-tone keypad selection system. To comply with the new reporting requirements, you will be able to 'give notice' through the AIVR system, including:

- · pre-trip notice
- amending notice (pre-trip)
- prior notice
- emergency notice
- transhipment notice
- weight notice
- retained fish notice.

You can also use the AIVR system to:

- check quota balances
- check the status of the 1.2 tonnes mud crab entitlement.

The department acknowledges that the new reporting requirements involve a significant change to commercial fishers. During the initial phase of implementation, the Queensland Boating and Fisheries Patrol officers will not be undertaking compliance action if you have not complied with the new reporting requirements. In the first instance, the focus will be on education and awareness. This would be followed over time by the appropriate enforcement action for non-compliance.

Note - The commercial fisher in control of the fishing operation **must** be the person who calls the AIVR to give a notice.

AIVR authentication

All east coast fisheries and Gulf of Carpentaria crab fishery

The AIVR system includes a **new authentication process** to make the reporting process easier for commercial fishers. After your first call to the new AIVR phone number and completing the initial setup, the AIVR system will 'remember' your details for subsequent calls.

You will need these details on hand for your first call to the new AIVR number:

- Commercial fisher licence number (CFL number)
 This is the licence number of the commercial fisher in control of the fishing operation.
- Commercial fisher licence PIN (CFL PIN)
 This is the PIN that is linked to the CFL.
- Primary commercial fishing licence number (PCFL number)

 This is the licence number on your licence card that is associated with the boat mark.
- Primary commercial fishing licence PIN (PCFL PIN)
 This is the PIN that is linked to the primary commercial fishing licence.

The AIVR system has been designed to 'remember' your details from your first call. **Subsequent calls** to the AIVR system will ask you to enter your CFL number, CFL PIN, and confirm the relevant boat mark.

If your PCFL PIN or PCFL details have changed, you will be prompted to enter the updated PCFL number and PCFL PIN.

You can view and reset your CFL PIN and PCFL PIN on 'FishNet Secure' under the My PINs tab.

If the commercial fisher in control of the fishing operation is not the PCFL authority holder, they will need to contact the authority holder to obtain the PCFL PIN.

Gulf of Carpentaria black jewfish, Gulf of Carpentaria shark, and shell grit fisheries

The authentication process remains unchanged for the Gulf of Carpentaria black jewfish, Gulf of Carpentaria shark, and shell grit fisheries. These fisheries will continue to use the PCFL number and PCFL PIN.

Streamline your AIVR reporting

Favourite species

For reporting catch through the AIVR, the system will read through all applicable species that you can report. To save time, we recommend that PCFL holders customise their species and fish forms on 'FishNet Secure' under the *My Favourite Species* tab. Once this is set-up, your favourite species and fish forms will be read out first by the AIVR system.

Landing codes

When giving a pre-trip notice, amending notice or emergency notice, you will be required to provide the details of your landing place.

Transport vessel codes

For reef line, Spanish mackerel, trawl (T1), coral or tropical rock lobster fisheries, you will be required to provide a transport vessel code when giving a transhipment notice.

Note: Coral and tropical tock lobster fishers are permitted to tranship to a PCFL held by the same authority holder. In this case the PCFL number must be entered instead of a transport vessel code.
