- creating and supporting opportunities for professional development for CLE workers
- keeping the Queensland Legal Assistance Forum (QLAF) informed of current CLE trends and innovative projects that will assist the legal assistance services sector in delivering services to disadvantaged Queenslanders.

The CLELAF will report its activities quarterly to the QLAF via a summary report.

This network will meet every quarter and rotate the meeting venue between services. Each meeting will decide a focus or theme to maximise value for worker time and enhance professional development and shared learning opportunities for network members. Our department will provide secretariat support.
