TRANSFER NOTICE and PROJECT DIRECTION

Shares in QML

1. Pursuant to section 9 of the Act, I, Andrew Fraser, Treasurer and Minister for Employment and Economic Development, do the following on the Effective Date:
 - (a) Transfer to QTH all of the rights, title and interests in, or relating to, all of the issued ordinary shares in QML, other than those shares that are already held by QTH, and provided that any beneficial interest held by the State in the shares will not be transferred.
 - (b) Provide that the shares transferred by this Transfer Notice will be held by QTH on trust for the State.
 - (c) Provide that the consideration for the transfer of an item provided for in this Transfer Notice is nil, or as otherwise determined by me in accordance with the Act.

Further Assurances

2. Pursuant to section 11 of the Act, I, Andrew Fraser, Treasurer and Minister for Employment and Economic Development, direct and require that QML and its Board must do and procure all such things (including the execution of all instruments, including without limiting the generality thereof, all documents required to record or register the above transfer) that are necessary, incidental or ancillary, to give effect to this Transfer Notice.

Definitions

In this Transfer Notice and Project Direction:

- (a) **Act** means the *Infrastructure Investment (Asset Restructuring and Disposal) Act 2009*
- (b) **Board** means the board of directors of QML;
- (c) **Effective Date** means the day that this Transfer Notice is gazetted;
- (d) **QML** means Queensland Motorways Limited ACN 067 242 513;
- (e) **QTH** means Queensland Treasury Holdings Pty Ltd ACN 011 027 295; and
- (f) **State** means the State of Queensland.

SCHEDULE 1 DEFINITIONS

1. In this Easement:
 - 1.1 “Acts” means the *Electricity Act 1994*, *Electrical Safety Act 2002* and *Government Owned Corporations Act 1993* and any amendments to them or any Acts superseding those Acts.
 - 1.2 “Date of this Easement” means the date of the gazette resumption notice.
 - 1.3 “Easement” means the rights obtained from the Owner by QETC including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.
 - 1.4 “Easement Land” means that portion of the Owner’s land over which this Easement is obtained.
 - 1.5 “Electricity Works” means such works, apparatus, structures and things as QETC may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying or transmitting electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or appurtenant works. The expression includes the Electricity Works existing on the Easement Land at the Date of this Easement or constructed on it after that date, and where the context permits it includes a reference to any part of the Electricity Works.
 - 1.6 “Lessee” has the same meaning as in the *Land Act 1994*.
 - 1.7 “Owner” means the Registered Proprietor or the Lessee, as applicable, together with its successors, successors in title and assigns. Where the term appears in Clauses 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 it includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen and contractors of the Owner and other persons authorised by the Owner to use or enter upon the Easement Land.
 - 1.8 “QETC” means the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited, together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of QETC and other persons authorised by QETC to exercise its rights under this Easement.
 - 1.9 “Registered Proprietor” has the same meaning as in the *Land Title Act 1994*.
 - 1.10 “Structure” means any building, improvement, plant, equipment, fixture, fitting, pole, cable, wire, pipe, tower, apparatus or chattel or of any kind whether on, over, in, under, across or through the Easement Land and includes by way of example but is not limited to any dwelling (including any extension or overhang of eaves or guttering), swimming pool, shed, retaining or other wall and lighting.

QETC’S RIGHTS

2. The QETC is acquiring this Easement to permit QETC the right to:
 - 2.1 convey and transmit electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms on, from, over, under and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works;
 - 2.2 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
 - 2.3 construct Electricity Works on, over, under or through the Easement Land;
 - 2.4 inspect, maintain, repair or replace the Electricity Works;
 - 2.5 clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction including soil

- 2.6 in the manner and by the means QETC considers appropriate;
- 2.6 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as QETC considers necessary;
- 2.7 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of QETC’s rights under this Easement by the Owner; and

the QETC may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

QETC’S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. QETC will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:
 - 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
 - 3.2 act reasonably.

QETC WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS

4.
 - 4.1 QETC will comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement Land.
 - 4.2 QETC will not be liable for:
 - 4.2.1 the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
 - 4.2.2 the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:
 - 5.1 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works or plant, equipment, tools or material of QETC on or near the Easement Land;
 - 5.2 interfere with or obstruct QETC in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement; or
 - 5.3 grow sugarcane within ten (10) metres of any tower, base or pole upon the Easement Land.

THINGS THE OWNER MAY ONLY DO IF QETC CONSENTS

6. The Owner must not, or consent to allow another party to, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of QETC:
 - 6.1 erect or place any Structure or make any additions or alterations to any Structure on the Easement Land;
 - 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
 - 6.3 place fill or other substance or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
 - 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Electricity Works are erected or located or are proposed to be erected or located;
 - 6.5 lay any metal conduit or pipe within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or other means of support on the Easement Land;
 - 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, the towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land;
 - 6.7 grow sugar cane on the Easement Land except:
 - 6.7.1 where the Owner is a holder of a valid cane supply contract under the *Sugar Industry*

Act 1999 as at the Date of this Easement;
and

- 6.7.2 the Owner grows sugar cane in accordance with clause 5.3 above;
- 6.8 plant or grow upon the Easement Land trees whose size or height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time; or
- 6.9 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any Structure, caravan, or other accommodation (including temporary accommodation) which may be located on the Easement Land,
- and QETC will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

THINGS QETC MAY DO IF THE OWNER IS IN BREACH

8. 8.1 In the event of any breach by the Owner of the terms of Clauses 5 and 6, QETC may in its absolute discretion give notice to the Owner to rectify the breach which may include the demolition or removal of all, or any part of, a Structure; and
- 8.2 If after 30 days, the Owner has not rectified the breach, then QETC may rectify the breach which may include:
- 8.2.1 the demolition and/or removal of a Structure or any part thereof upon the Easement Land; or
- 8.2.2 mitigation or remedial work to restore the safety of the Electricity Works without liability to the Owner for reinstatement, restitution, damages, compensation or otherwise.
- 8.3 Notwithstanding anything contained in Clauses 8.1 or 8.2, in the case of an emergency, QETC may enter the Easement Land to remedy a defect, eliminate an actual or potential danger or remove a Structure or any part thereof that is affecting, or may affect, the safety of Electricity Works or continuity of supply without giving notice.
- 8.4 If QETC acts under clause 8.3, it must give the notice, if not already given, mentioned in clause 8.1 as soon as practicable.
- 8.5 Any costs incurred by QETC in relation to either Clauses 8.2 or 8.3, or both, may be recovered from the Owner.

INDEMNITY

9. QETC indemnifies the Owner against all actions, suits, proceedings, demands, costs, losses, damages and expenses arising out of or in respect of any act or omission of QETC in the use or attempted use of the Easement Land by QETC, except where such actions, suits, proceedings, claims, demands, costs, losses, damages or expenses arise as a result of any negligent act or omission of the Owner, breach of this Easement or of the law.

PUBLIC RISK

10. QETC will effect and keep current a public risk insurance policy in respect of this Easement and the use by QETC of the Easement Land for an amount which QETC considers appropriate to the public liability risk involved but in any event not less than FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS (\$50,000,000.00).

TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No 45) 2010

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No 45) 2010*.

Easements taken [s.6 and 9(7) of the Act]

2. The Easements described in Schedule 2 are taken by Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited A.C.N. 078 849 233 for Electrical Works purposes and purposes incidental thereto and vest in Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited A.C.N. 078 849 233 on and from 10 December 2010.

Rights and obligations

3. That the rights and obligations conferred and imposed by each Easement include the matters set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1 DEFINITIONS

1. In this Easement:
 - 1.1 "Acts" means the *Electricity Act 1994*, *Electrical Safety Act 2002* and *Government Owned Corporations Act 1993* and any amendments to them or any Acts superseding those Acts.
 - 1.2 "Date of this Easement" means the date of the gazette resumption notice.
 - 1.3 "Easement" means the rights obtained from the Owner by QETC including but not limited to the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.
 - 1.4 "Easement Land" means that portion of the Owner's land over which this Easement is obtained.
 - 1.5 "Electricity Works" means such works, apparatus, structures and things as QETC may in its absolute discretion consider appropriate as a means of conveying or transmitting electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms, including conductors, cables, towers, aerials, poles, foundations, ground anchorages, supports and other associated or appurtenant works. The expression includes the Electricity Works existing on the Easement Land at the Date of this Easement or constructed on it after that date, and where the context permits it includes a reference to any part of the Electricity Works.
 - 1.6 "Lessee" has the same meaning as in the *Land Act 1994*.
 - 1.7 "Owner" means the Registered Proprietor or the Lessee, as applicable, together with its successors, successors in title and assigns. Where the term appears in Clauses 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 it includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen and contractors of the Owner and other persons authorised by the Owner to use or enter upon the Easement Land.
 - 1.8 "QETC" means the Queensland Electricity Transmission Corporation Limited, together with its successors and assigns and others authorised by it. Where the context permits, the term includes the servants, agents, employees, workmen, linesmen, contractors of QETC and other persons authorised by QETC to exercise its rights under this Easement.
 - 1.9 "Registered Proprietor" has the same meaning as in the *Land Title Act 1994*.
 - 1.10 "Structure" means any building, improvement, plant, equipment, fixture, fitting, pole, cable, wire, pipe, tower, apparatus or chattel or of any kind whether on, over, in, under, across or through the Easement Land and includes by way of example but is not limited to any dwelling (including any extension or overhang of eaves or guttering), swimming pool, shed, retaining or other wall and lighting.

QETC'S RIGHTS

2. The QETC is acquiring this Easement to permit QETC the right to:
 - 2.1 convey and transmit electricity, telecommunications and other electromagnetic energy in all its forms on, from, over, under and through the Easement Land by Electricity Works;

- 2.2 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land, with vehicles, plant and equipment, if necessary, to exercise its rights under this Easement;
- 2.3 construct Electricity Works on, over, under or through the Easement Land;
- 2.4 inspect, maintain, repair or replace the Electricity Works;
- 2.5 clear the Easement Land of trees, undergrowth or vegetation or any obstruction including soil in the manner and by the means QETC considers appropriate;
- 2.6 construct and maintain on the Easement Land such tracks, roads, gates, fences and other structures and works as QETC considers necessary;
- 2.7 enter upon and traverse the Easement Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any infringement by the Owner of QETC's rights under this Easement by the Owner; and

the QETC may in connection with its use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of its rights, powers, discretion and functions under the Acts, or any other Act or at law as it sees fit.

QETC'S OBLIGATIONS TO THE OWNER

3. QETC will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:

- 3.1 cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
- 3.2 act reasonably.

QETC WILL COMPLY WITH SAFETY LAWS

4. 4.1 QETC will comply with all laws regarding the exercise of its rights under this Easement and the safety of persons to use the Easement Land.
- 4.2 QETC will not be liable for:
 - 4.2.1 the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
 - 4.2.2 the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

THINGS THE OWNER MUST NOT DO

5. The Owner must not:
 - 5.1 interfere with, damage or place at risk the Electricity Works or plant, equipment, tools or material of QETC on or near the Easement Land;
 - 5.2 interfere with or obstruct QETC in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement; or
 - 5.3 grow sugarcane within ten (10) metres of any tower, base or pole upon the Easement Land.

THINGS THE OWNER MAY ONLY DO IF QETC CONSENTS

6. The Owner must not, or consent to allow another party to, after the Date of this Easement, without first obtaining the written consent of QETC:
 - 6.1 erect or place any Structure or make any additions or alterations to any Structure on the Easement Land;
 - 6.2 erect any fence that is higher than three (3) metres on the Easement Land;
 - 6.3 place fill or other substance or carry out any works or do anything whatsoever on the Easement Land which would reduce the clearance from ground level of the conductors or transmission lines below the minimum statutory clearance required from time to time for the voltage class of the transmission line on the Easement Land;
 - 6.4 cause or allow, except in the case of force majeure, the inundation of those parts of the Easement Land where any Electricity Works are erected or located or are proposed to be erected or located;
 - 6.5 lay any metal conduit or pipe within five (5) metres of the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or other means of support on the Easement Land;
 - 6.6 do any act or thing which jeopardises the foundations, ground anchorages, supports, the towers or poles, including (without limitation) excavate or remove any

soil, sand or gravel within a distance of twenty (20) metres from the base of any tower, pole, foundation, ground anchorage or support on the Easement Land; grow sugar cane on the Easement Land except:

- 6.7.1 where the Owner is a holder of a valid cane supply contract under the *Sugar Industry Act 1999* as at the Date of this Easement; and
- 6.7.2 the Owner grows sugar cane in accordance with clause 5.3 above;
- 6.8 plant or grow upon the Easement Land trees whose size or height would in any way interfere with the statutory clearance that may exist from time to time; or
- 6.9 reside in or permit anyone to reside in or occupy any Structure, caravan, or other accommodation (including temporary accommodation) which may be located on the Easement Land,

and QETC will not unreasonably withhold its consent but in granting any consent may impose reasonable conditions.

OWNER MAY USE EASEMENT

7. The Owner may use the Easement Land for any lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement.

THINGS QETC MAY DO IF THE OWNER IS IN BREACH

8. 8.1 In the event of any breach by the Owner of the terms of Clauses 5 and 6, QETC may in its absolute discretion give notice to the Owner to rectify the breach which may include the demolition or removal of all, or any part of, a Structure; and
- 8.2 If after 30 days, the Owner has not rectified the breach, then QETC may rectify the breach which may include:
 - 8.2.1 the demolition and/or removal of a Structure or any part thereof upon the Easement Land; or
 - 8.2.2 mitigation or remedial work to restore the safety of the Electricity Works
- 8.3 without liability to the Owner for reinstatement, restitution, damages, compensation or otherwise.
- 8.3 Notwithstanding anything contained in Clauses 8.1 or 8.2, in the case of an emergency, QETC may enter the Easement Land to remedy a defect, eliminate an actual or potential danger or remove a Structure or any part thereof that is affecting, or may affect, the safety of Electricity Works or continuity of supply without giving notice.
- 8.4 If QETC acts under clause 8.3, it must give the notice, if not already given, mentioned in clause 8.1 as soon as practicable.
- 8.5 Any costs incurred by QETC in relation to either Clauses 8.2 or 8.3, or both, may be recovered from the Owner.

INDEMNITY

9. DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

2010/01

APPLICATION

- These arrangements apply to all Ministerial Staff Members.

REFERENCES

- *Ministerial and Other Office Holder Staff Act 2010 – Division 4*

DEFINITIONS

- **Ministerial Staff Member** means a person employed as a staff member in the office of a Minister.
- **Pecuniary Interests** – means interests involving an actual or potential financial gain or loss.
- **Non-Pecuniary Interests** – means interests that may arise from relationships, or other personal involvements.
- **Conflict of Interest** – is a situation arising from conflict between the performance of official responsibilities and private or personal interests. Conflicts of interest may be actual, or be perceived to exist, or potentially exist at some time in the future.

Directive

Principles

- This policy should be interpreted broadly. Its application should not be limited to a literal reading of the provisions.
- Ministerial Staff Members are responsible for fully disclosing their interests in accordance with information to be declared as set out below in this directive.
- Ministerial Staff Members are also responsible for disclosing within their knowledge the interests of their partner and/or dependents in accordance with information to be declared as set out below in this directive.
- Responsibility for the recognition of a real or perceived conflict of interest rests solely with the Ministerial Staff Member concerned.
- Ministerial Staff Members are responsible for acquiring and being familiar with the information released from time to time by the Integrity Commissioner and the Crime and Misconduct Commission concerning conflict of interest issues.
- Ministerial Staff Members who give advice to a Minister should be aware of the role of the Queensland Integrity Commissioner and seek counsel on any issue that may arise as a conflict of interest or potential conflict of interest.

General Conditions

- Ministerial Staff Members are responsible for providing a Declaration of Interests –
 - within one month after commencing employment as a Ministerial Staff Member;
 - within one month of a change of Minister;
 - whenever there is a change to the Ministerial Staff Member's interests; and
 - on an annual basis no later than 30 June each year.
- Ministers shall sign and date all Declaration of Interests upon lodgement.

Transitional Provisions

- Currently employed Ministerial Staff Members who, at the time of commencement of the *Ministerial and Other Office Holder Staff Act 2010* – Division 4, have already provided a statement on or after 1 June last occurring that included all the information required to be included in the Declaration of Interests are not required to provide a new Declaration of Interests form, unless there has been a material change to the Ministerial Staff Member's Interests since that previous statement.

Information to be declared

- Information about interests which Ministerial Staff Members shall declare includes information in relation to all significant *pecuniary* interests and relevant *non-pecuniary* interests of -
 - the Ministerial Staff Member,
 - their partner; and
 - any dependents.
- The interests referred to above are those which may have, or may be perceived to have, the potential for a conflict of interest and may include –
 - a) shareholdings in public and private companies;
 - b) family and business trusts and nominee companies;
 - c) bonds, debentures and like investments;
 - d) savings and investment accounts;
 - e) partnerships;
 - f) real estate;
 - g) directorships in or employment by public and private companies;
 - h) other assets;
 - i) other substantial sources of income;
 - j) other interests (pecuniary or non-pecuniary);
 - k) liabilities;
 - l) organisational memberships.

Identifying a conflict of interest

- A Ministerial Staff Member who identifies that he or she has a conflict of interest, or potential for a conflict of interest, must disclose the circumstances to their Minister.
- The Ministerial Staff Member must not take action in the matter unless authorised by the Minister.
- The Minister may direct the Ministerial Staff Member to resolve the conflict or possible conflict between their private or personal interests and their official responsibilities.

Change to interests

- When interests change the Ministerial Staff Member must submit a **Variation of Declaration of Interests** form as soon as practicable after the relevant facts of the change come to the knowledge of the person.
- Change to interests may include:
 - a) any significant change in the interests about which information is required including acquisition, divestment or an altered relationship in the interest;
 - b) a significant change to the official responsibilities of the staff member; or
 - c) a new personal relationship with a partner.

Storage of records

- Completed Declaration of Interests records will be filed securely with the Minister.
- Upon the Ministerial Staff Member ceasing employment in the office of the Minister, their declaration of interest documentation will be securely filed on their employee personal file.

Access to records

- Declarations are to be maintained in the strictest confidence. Unless required by law, access to Declarations of Interests is limited to the Ministerial Staff Member and the Minister.
- Declaration of Interests records may be the subject of applications for access under the *Right to Information Act 2009* and/or the *Information Privacy Act 2009*. Each application for access would be considered on a case by case basis before a decision is made on whether it is in the public interest to release the document.
- In the event of receipt of an application for access to a Declaration of Interests, the Ministerial Services Branch is required to consult the Ministerial Staff Member who made the declaration about their views on the application prior to any decision being made to release the document.

Procedures

- Within one month of commencement, Ministerial Staff Members shall lodge a completed **Declaration of Interests** form (F2F1) with the Minister.

Change of Minister

- Within one month of a change of Minister, Ministerial Staff Members shall lodge a completed **Declaration of Interests** form (F2F1) with the new Minister.

Annual Review

- No later than 30 June each year, Ministerial Staff Members shall review their existing Declaration and –
 - where the Declaration is unaltered, submit an **Annual Review of Declaration of Interests – No Variation** form (F2F2) to the Minister;
 - where changes have occurred in the preceding 12 months submit a **Declaration of Interests** form (F2F1) to the Minister.

Change in Interests

- Where there is a change to interests, Ministerial Staff Members must notify the Minister as soon as practicable of that change occurring, by lodging a **Variation of Declaration of Interests** form (F2F3).

Retention of Declarations

- The Minister shall initial and date all **Declarations** received and store securely in the ministerial office.

SCHEDULE 2

Acquisition of Land Act 1967 State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971

Rights and Obligations Under Easement for Infrastructure Corridor Callide Infrastructure Corridor State Development Area

1 INTERPRETATION

1.1 In this Schedule:

“Burdened Land” means the whole of the land owned (or leased, where the principal tenure is leasehold) by the Landowner that is burdened by the Easement;

“CIC Land Use Protocol” means the land use protocol developed by The Coordinator-General for the Callide Infrastructure Corridor State Development Area, as may be amended by The Coordinator-General from time to time.

“Consequential Loss” means any Loss, however caused, which is a consequence of another Loss (regardless of whether or not the possibility of the Loss was contemplated or communicated when the Easement was granted).

“Constructor” means the person or persons licensed from time to time by The Coordinator-General to construct and or maintain Infrastructure on the Easement Area.

“Construction Licence” means a licence from The Coordinator-General to a Constructor which permits the construction of Infrastructure on the Easement Area.

“Coordinator-General” means The Coordinator-General, the corporation sole constituted under the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971* and where the context permits, the servants, agents, contractors, subcontractors and licensees of The Coordinator-General and other persons authorised by The Coordinator-General to exercise The Coordinator-General’s rights under the Easement.

“Easement” means the easement taken by The Coordinator-General including the terms and conditions contained in this Schedule.

“Easement Area” means that portion of the Burdened Land taken by The Coordinator-General for the Easement.

“Infrastructure” means anything relating to the transportation, movement, transmission or flow of anything, including for example, goods, materials, substances (including, without limitation, gas of any kind), matter, particles with or without charge, light, energy, information and anything generated or produced as well as anything reasonably associated with or ancillary to such things which may be below or above ground but does not include road (except for access purposes) or rail infrastructure.

“Landowner” means the registered owner (or, where the principal tenure of the Burdened Land is leasehold, the registered lessee) of the Burdened Land, from time to time.

“Loss” means any damage, claim, action, loss, expense, proceeding or liability.

“Operator” means a person or persons licensed from time to time by The Coordinator-General to operate and or maintain Infrastructure on the Easement Area.

“Operation Licence” means a licence from The Coordinator-General to an Operator which permits the operation of Infrastructure on the Easement Area.

1.2 If the Landowner or The Coordinator-General consists of two or more persons at any time:

(a) a reference in the Easement to that party is to be read as a reference to each of those persons individually, and each combination of them jointly; and

(b) those persons are bound and benefited by the Easement both individually and in each combination of them jointly.

1.3 A reference in the Easement to a person includes a reference to a body corporate (including a local government) and every other kind of legal person.

1.4 The Easement burdens the Burdened Land in accordance with section 6(2) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*.

1.5 A reference to any legislation includes subordinate legislation under it and includes that legislation and subordinate legislation as modified or replaced.

2 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF COORDINATOR-GENERAL

2.1 The Coordinator-General and all persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by The

Coordinator-General including but not limited to Constructors, Operators and the surveyors, servants, agents, consultants, contractors and sub-contractors of The Coordinator-General, Constructors and Operators may from time to time:

- (a) construct, install, repair, maintain, test, operate, remove, replace, clean, clear, upgrade, add to and alter any Infrastructure on, in, under, through or over the Easement Area;
- (b) inspect, patrol (including aerial patrol) or survey the Easement Area, or any Infrastructure on it;
- (c) undertake mowing, slashing and vegetation (including without limitation timber, trees and crops) management, control or removal in relation to the Easement Area;
- (d) break open the soil of the Easement Area (both on the surface and subsurface) for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the other things that The Coordinator-General can do under the Easement;
- (e) enter, exit and traverse by whatever means, and remain on (for so long as is necessary) the Easement Area for the purpose of doing or getting ready to do any of the things The Coordinator-General can do under the Easement, with all vehicles, plant, equipment, machinery, tools and materials considered necessary by The Coordinator-General, or anyone authorised by The Coordinator-General;
- (f) pull down or break open any fencing on the Easement Area (including the installation of gates in such fencing at the cost of The Coordinator-General) in order to enter or exit it (but only after, except in the case of an emergency, giving reasonable prior notice to the Landowner if any livestock are contained within the fenced area);
- (g) scour water from any pipeline that forms part of any Infrastructure and discharge that water on to the Easement Area;
- (h) remove and dispose of spoil created as a consequence of exercising its rights under this Easement;
- (i) take anything onto the Easement Area and use and operate what has been taken onto the Easement Area; and
- (j) disturb livestock as reasonably necessary and required to properly manage and use the Easement Area;
- (k) during any construction of the Infrastructure, divert, restrict, cross, discharge into or draw water from any lake, dam, stream, watercourse or similar facility;
- (l) do on the Easement Area anything which in The Coordinator-General's opinion is necessary or convenient for, or incidental to exercising The Coordinator-General's rights under the Easement, including, as examples but without limitation:
 - (1) stockpiling anything required for or relating to the

 - (ii) restoration of the Easement Area pursuant to clause 2.3(d); and
 - (iii) payment of compensation pursuant to clause 2.5.
- (2) grant an Operation Licence to an Operator unless and until:
- (i) The Coordinator-General has previously issued a Construction Licence for the relevant Infrastructure ; and
 - (ii) The Coordinator-General is satisfied the Constructor (or its successors) has complied with clause 2.3(d) or paid compensation pursuant to clause 2.5.

Easement Area, including Constructors and Operators must:

- (a) comply with the CIC Land Use Protocol, or cause the CIC Land Use Protocol to be complied with;
- (b) ensure that any work done on the Easement Area is done properly in accordance with:
 - (i) standard industry practice from time to time;
 - (ii) the applicable Australian Standards (or other equivalent) for such activities from time to time;
- (c) cause as little inconvenience as is reasonably practicable to the Landowner;
- (d) restore the Easement Area as nearly as is reasonably practicable to its former condition if the Easement Area is damaged or changed by the work done on the Easement Area;
- (e) comply with all applicable laws regarding occupational health and safety in the undertaking of any work done on the Easement Area;
- (f) carry out all activities on the Easement Area in accordance with all relevant Commonwealth, State and local government laws; and
- (g) from the commencement of construction on the Easement Area, take all reasonable steps and precautions, in connection with any work performed on the Easement Area and at all times while such work is being performed, adopt

2.3 In exercising rights and powers under the Easement, The Coordinator-General and/or persons authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by The Coordinator-General to use the

methods of practice to prevent and treat any outbreak of weed infestation on the Easement Area (including parthenium weed) arising from the work performed on the Easement Area. For the avoidance of doubt The Coordinator-General and all such persons authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-General to perform work in the Easement Area shall be under no obligation to eradicate any weed infestation on the Easement Area which existed prior to the commencement of work in the Easement Area or subsequently results other than due to work performed on the Easement Area.

2.4 If the Landowner breaches any term of the Easement, The Coordinator-General or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area may do anything that is reasonably necessary to correct the breach (such as removing a structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement) and recover the reasonable costs of doing so from the Landowner. Any such action shall be taken without The Coordinator-General or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-General incurring any liability to the Landowner, and shall be without prejudice to any rights which The Coordinator-General or person authorised may have against the Landowner as a consequence of the Landowner's breach.

2.5 Where The Coordinator-General, or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-

General to use the Easement Area, cause loss or damage to the property of the Landowner on the Easement Area, The Coordinator-General or persons authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-General to use the Easement Area must either:

- (1) repair, or replace the property of the Landowner as nearly as reasonably practicable to the condition existing at the time of the loss or damage or pay the Landowner reasonable compensation to repair or replace the property of the Landowner as nearly as reasonably practicable to the condition existing at the time of the loss or damage; or
- (2) if it is not reasonable or desirable to repair or replace the property, compensate the Landowner for the loss or damage caused.

2.6 Notwithstanding anything in this Easement or the CIC Land Use Protocol, The Coordinator-General's liability:

- (1) is limited in accordance with the *State Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971*; and
- (2) excludes Consequential Loss howsoever caused.

3 RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF LANDOWNER

3.1 The Landowner must:

- (a) allow The Coordinator-General and persons authorised by The Coordinator-General unobstructed access to, and egress from, the Easement Area at all times;
- (b) not excavate, tunnel under, drill or erect or permit to be erected any improvement,

- building, structure, pipeline, services, private road or access track, fence, driveway, paving, billboard, or cable in, under, on, through or above the Easement Area without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (c) maintain and repair, and not change any such improvement, building, structure, pipeline, services, private road or access track, fence, driveway, paving, billboard or cable in, under, on, above or through the Easement Area (other than removing any structure erected on the Easement Area in breach of the Easement);
- (d) avoid activities which might adversely affect the subsoil or surface soil stability and surface drainage of the Easement Area without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (e) not place or stockpile fill, soil, sand, gravel or any other substance, or alter the ground level, or alter or disturb the present grades of the Easement Area or change its topography or allow inundation of the Easement Area by water without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (f) not plant orchards, vines, trees, and shrubs on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (g) not crop, dig, plough or carry out deep ripping or blade ploughing of the Easement Area without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (h) not cause or allow any combustible or hazardous materials to be stored on the Easement Area;
- (i) exercise reasonable care to ensure that any Infrastructure on the Easement Area is not damaged;
- (j) not interfere with, damage or place at risk any Infrastructure on the Easement Area from time to time or interfere with anything that The Coordinator-General or a person authorised, permitted or licensed by The Coordinator-General is storing or has placed on the Easement Area from time to time (including plant and equipment, stockpiles of soil dug up from or from under the Easement Area or any other stockpiles) without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (k) not take onto the Easement Area any vehicles or equipment weighing in excess of the maximum legal loading for such vehicles or equipment on Queensland roads;
- (l) not cause or allow any vehicle or equipment to remain on the Easement Area without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
- (m) not cause or allow a nuisance that adversely affects The Coordinator-General's rights and powers pursuant to the Easement or any Infrastructure on the

- Easement Area from time to time;
- (n) promptly abate any such nuisance;
 - (o) use its best endeavours to prevent anyone from doing anything that the Landowner must not do under the Easement. The Landowner must not allow or authorise anyone to do anything which the Landowner is not permitted to do pursuant to the Easement;
 - (p) promptly notify The Coordinator-General if it becomes aware of any defect in, or damage to the Infrastructure, or of anyone doing anything which the Landowner is not permitted to do pursuant to the Easement;
 - (q) not interfere with or obstruct The Coordinator-General, or any person authorised, permitted or licensed from time to time by The Coordinator-General, in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers pursuant to the Easement;
 - (r) not grant any rights to any person in relation to the Easement Area to the extent the granting of those other rights could or will conflict or interfere with the Infrastructure or the exercise of any of The Coordinator-General's rights and powers pursuant to the Easement;
 - (s) provide The Coordinator-General with current contact details for the Landowner and must immediately update The Coordinator-General if these details change;
 - (t) not cause or allow any electromagnetic or like interference to the Infrastructure, including, without limitation, construction of railway lines or power lines (of any voltage) on or across the Easement Area, or electrification of Easement Area boundary fences, without the prior written consent of The Coordinator-General;
 - (u) comply with the CIC Land Use Protocol and all lawful directions issued by The Coordinator-General or persons authorised pursuant to that protocol.
- 3.2 The Landowner is responsible for the acts and omissions of anyone claiming through the Landowner (such as tenants, licensees and mortgagees). An act or omission of any of those persons is treated for the purposes of the Easement as if it was an act or omission of the Landowner personally.
- 3.3 Without in any way limiting the provisions of this Easement, the Landowner acknowledges that The Coordinator-General intends to grant multiple Construction Licences and multiple Operation Licences.
- 3.4 The Landowner:
- (a) may undertake the following activities on the Easement Area without seeking the consent of The Coordinator-General, provided the activities are not likely to adversely impact the construction, use, maintenance, alteration, repair and replacement of the Infrastructure:

- i. open dry land grazing of cattle, sheep and other animals;
 - ii. carrying out weed control and eradication programs;
 - iii. carrying out top dressing, application of fertilisers and pasture seeding;
 - iv. pasture growth; and
 - v. ongoing maintenance of the Burdened Land.
- (b) will carry out these activities at its own risk and subject to the right of The Coordinator-General or the Licensees to remove any Landowner property, in the exercise of its (or their) rights under the Easement. The Landowner acknowledges that no compensation will be payable by The Coordinator-General or a Licensee for any damage or loss caused due to the use of the Easement Area for these purposes.

4 OWNERSHIP OF INFRASTRUCTURE

All Infrastructure and other things brought into or installed on the Easement Area from time to time by The Coordinator-General will, as between the Landowner and The Coordinator-General, notwithstanding any affixation to the Easement Area, remain the property of The Coordinator-General. The Coordinator-General may remove the whole or part of the Infrastructure at any time and will make good any damage to the Burdened Land so caused.

5 STAMPING AND REGISTERING OF EASEMENT

The Coordinator-General must:

- (a) stamp (if required) and register the Easement; and

- (b) pay all duty and registration fees (if any) on the Easement.

6 MINING OR PETROLEUM TENEMENT

The Landowner must give The Coordinator-General a copy of any notification received by the Landowner in respect of any application for a mining or petroleum tenement under the *Mineral Resources Act 1989*, the *Petroleum Act 1923*, the *Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004* or any similar or replacement legislation, in respect of land which includes all or any part of the Easement Area, within 7 days after the Landowner receives such notification.

7 FURTHER ASSURANCES

The Landowner must execute every deed, instrument, assurance or other document and do all such things as may be necessary to secure the rights of The Coordinator-General conferred by the Easement as The Coordinator-General may reasonably require, including (without limitation) obtaining the consent of any person necessary and producing the title document for the Burdened Land and executing all documents necessary to give effect to any proposed assignment, transfer, encumbrance or other dealing by The Coordinator-General in respect of the Easement Area.

8 NOTICE

8.1 General

Any notice, demand, certification, process or other communication given in relation to the Easement must be in writing in English and must be signed by the party giving the notice or by an authorised officer or agent of the party giving the notice.

8.2 How to give a communication

A communication may be given by being:

- (a) personally delivered;
- (b) left at the party's current address for notices;
- (c) sent to the party's current address for notices by pre-paid ordinary mail or, if the address is outside Australia, by pre-paid airmail; or
- (d) sent by fax to the party's current fax number for notices.

9 COORDINATOR-GENERAL'S CONSENT

- (a) Subject to clause 9(b), The Coordinator-General may conditionally or unconditionally give or withhold any consent to be given under the Easement

and is not obliged to give reasons for doing so.

- (b) Subject to clause 9(c), The Coordinator-General will not unreasonably refuse or withhold its consent to the Landowner:

- (i) maintaining any existing private road or access track within the Easement Area;

- (ii) where consent of The Coordinator-General is stated to be not to be unreasonably withheld under the CIC Land Use Protocol; and

- (iii) erecting and maintaining any fence across the Easement Area if:

- (A) each fence includes a lockable gate in a location agreed with The Coordinator-General; and

- (B) at the election of The Coordinator-General, the Landowner installs a lock on the gate and supplies a set of keys to the lockable gate to The Coordinator-General or The Coordinator-General installs the lock and supplies a set of keys to the Landowner.

- (c) It will be reasonable for The Coordinator-General to refuse or withhold its consent if the actions of the

Landowner are, in The Coordinator-General's opinion, likely to jeopardise the safety, security, construction, repair, maintenance, replacement or operation of, or interfere with the Infrastructure or restrict The Coordinator-General's access to, along or across, or egress from, the Easement Area.

10 SEVERABILITY

- (a) Subject to clause 10(b), if a provision of the Easement is illegal or unenforceable in any relevant jurisdiction, it may be severed for the purposes of that jurisdiction without affecting the enforceability of the other provisions of the Easement.
- (b) Clause 10(a) does not apply if severing the provision materially alters the scope and nature of the Easement or the relative commercial or financial positions of the parties, or would be contrary to public policy.
