

#### Program highlights

- \$2.598 billion Logan and Gold Coast Faster Rail (Kuraby to Beenleigh) upgrade (jointly funded with the Australian Government)
- \$1 billion funding commitment towards upgrades of the Inland Freight Route (Charters Towers to Mungindi) (jointly funded with the Australian Government). Project details and timing subject to negotiation with Australian Government.
- \$600 million Queensland Train Manufacturing Program which forms part of the \$7.1 billion to boost Queensland's train manufacturing industry and build and operate 65 trains
- **\$544.5 million for the Warrego Highway** (jointly funded with the Australian Government). Project details and timing subject to further planning and negotiation with the Australian Government. The Queensland Governments initial priority is upgrading the Mount Crosby Road interchange.
- \$374.1 million New Generation Rollingstock, European Train Control System fitment, install new signalling

### Endnotes

- (1) Projects on the Local Network may include a local government co-contribution in the Indicative total budget. This co-contribution may not be included in the year allocations or table subtotals, which only show the amount managed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- (2) Estimated expenditure to 30 June 2022 includes expenditure from prior years and estimated expenditure for 2021-22. Costs may exclude local government contributions not managed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- (3) Program details and timing subject to negotiation with the Australian Government, noting the Queensland Government's priority for upgrades between Mackay and Proserpine, and between Gladstone and Rockhampton.
- (4) The Bruce Highway Trust Advisory Council (BHTAC) will develop a new 15-year vision and rolling five-year Action Plans for the Bruce Highway. On completion of the BHTAC work, any realised savings will be invested in progressing priorities on the Bruce Highway.
- (5) Represents Queensland Government's contribution towards continued joint investment on the Bruce Highway of \$1 billion per annum (80:20 federal:state funding basis). Project details subject to consultation with the Bruce Highway Trust Advisory Council and negotiation with the Australian Government, noting the Queensland Government's priorities include duplication of sections between Gladstone and Rockhampton, further capacity upgrades including to the North of Townsville and upgrades to the southern sections of the Bruce Highway (in line with the incoming Australian Government's 2022 Federal Election commitments).
