# Understanding your liquor licence

You must keep your liquor licence on the premises and produce it to an OLGR investigator or police officer, if requested.

## **TRADING HOURS**

You have a 30-minute grace period after your trading hours end for patrons to finish the drinks they bought beforehand.

### **STANDARD CONDITIONS**

Standard conditions are those that generally attach to all licences of a particular type. You must comply with all conditions or you will be committing an offence under the *Liquor Act 1992*.

#### **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY**

The main activity your business is conducting e.g:

- a restaurant's principal activity is serving meals to be eaten on the premises—the supply of liquor is a secondary aspect of the business
- a pub's principal activity may be the sale of liquor for consumption on and off premises.

#### **FAST RESPONSE**

This is a technical, acoustic testing term. A noise testing device set to a fast response setting responds to changes in sound much faster than it would in a slow response setting. This allows it to provide more detail and show varying noise levels quickly. It will pick up any short, fast sounds that a slow setting would otherwise miss.

#### **SPECIFIC CONDITIONS**

Specific conditions will generally address the specific risk of an individual premises and its layout. For example, they may include tailored noise limits or conditions that enforce any planning limitations.
