*Constitution of Queensland 2001***ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 2) 2021****TABLE OF PROVISIONS**

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Short Title

1. This order in council may be cited as the *Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2021*.

Administrative Arrangements

2. (1) The public business of the State is distributed among Ministers as set out in the Schedule.

(2) Each Minister is to administer the matters set out in the Schedule next to the Minister's title as follows:
