TAKING OF EASEMENT NOTICE (No. 2700) 2014

Short title

1. This notice may be cited as the *Taking of Easement Notice (No. 2700) 2014*.

Easement to be taken [s.15C(5) of the *Acquisition of Land Act 1967*]

2. Following agreement in writing, the easement described in the Schedule is taken for a purpose incidental to the purpose of transport (busway and the facilitation of busway transport infrastructure), namely, Easement of Support, as from 7 March 2014, and vests in the Chief Executive, Department of Transport and Main Roads, as constructing authority for the State of Queensland, for an estate in fee simple.

Terms and Conditions of Easement

3. The terms and conditions of the easement are set out in Schedule 1.

SCHEDULE 1

Terms of Easement

The following rights and obligations shall apply and be imposed by the proposed Easement of Support over land described in Schedule 1.

1. Background

- (a) The Owner is the registered owner of the Owner's Land.
- (b) The Busway includes a tunnel that runs under parts of the Owner's Land.
- (c) This Easement is for support of the Busway.
- (d) The Owner must seek approval for New Improvements under this Easement and intends to do so.

2. Definitions and Interpretation

2.1 Definitions

In this Easement, unless the context otherwise requires or the contrary intention appears, the following terms will have the meanings respectively assigned to them:

- (a) **Approvals** means all necessary consents, permits, approvals, licences and certificates from all Council and other government authorities having jurisdiction over the Easement Area in relation to the New Improvements.

- (b) **Busway** means the volumetric lot 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 and 16 on SP240981 and 17, 18 on SP240983 of busway land known as the Eastern Busway (containing all busway transport infrastructure (as defined under the Transport Act) and includes all utilities and services) located below or adjacent to the Owner's Land, but does not include the New Improvements.
- (c) **Chief Executive** means the chief executive under the Transport Act and the TPC Act.
- (d) **Chief Executive's Delegate** means an officer duly authorised in writing by the Chief Executive to deal with land that has been the subject of an acquisition for transport or incidental purposes under the TPC Act or to deal with land under the Transport Act.
- (e) **Council** means the Brisbane City Council.
- (f) **Date of the Easement** means the date this notice is published in the Queensland Government Gazette or agreed, whichever is the earlier.
- (g) **Development Application** means a development application by the Owner lodged with the Council which relates to and includes all or part of the Owner's Land .
- (h) **Easement** means the rights over the Easement Area obtained by the Chief Executive from the Owner on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1.
- (i) **Easement Area** means that part of the land (and any improvements located on that land) described in this notice as the land taken.
- (j) **Engineering Specifications** means the loading and unloading specifications listed in this notice under the heading "Engineering Specifications".
- (k) **SP Act** means the *Sustainable Planning Act 2009* and any amendments to it or any Act superseding that Act.
- (l) **New Improvements** means any works, including earthworks, demolition works and construction of new improvements which the Owner may wish to carry out on the Easement Area from time to time. The term does not include any works above natural ground level which would not place an additional load on the Busway tunnel beyond any load for which a New Improvements approval under Clause 8 has already been granted and implemented and which is otherwise in accordance with the Engineering Specifications.
- (m) **Owner** means the registered owner of the Owner's Land.
- (n) **Owner's Land** means the whole of the land described in this notice as the land out of which the Easement Area has been taken.
- (o) **State** means the State of Queensland represented by the Department of Transport and Main Roads (or any other department as nominated by the State of Queensland from time to time) and includes the Chief Executive acting in his or her capacity under the Transport Act or the TPC Act.
- (p) **TPC Act** means the *Transport Planning and Coordination Act 1994* and any amendments to it or any Act superseding that Act.
- (q) **Transport Act** means the *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994* and any amendments to it or any Act superseding that Act.

2.2 Interpretation

- (a) Headings are for convenience and ease of reference only and will not be relevant to or affect the construction, interpretation or meaning of this Easement.
- (b) A reference to any statute, regulation, ordinance, local law or other statutory instrument shall be deemed to extend to all statutes, regulations, ordinances, local laws or other statutory instruments amending, consolidating or replacing them.
- (c) Words indicating the singular number include the plural number and vice versa.
- (d) Words indicating one gender shall include all other genders.
- (e) A reference to a person includes a reference to corporations and other entities recognised by law and includes a reference to a person's legal personal representatives, administrators, successors, assigns and transferees.
- (f) A covenant or agreement on the part of two or more persons shall bind them jointly and severally.

- (g) Where under or pursuant to this Easement the day on or by which any act, matter or thing is to be done is not a Business Day, such an act, matter or thing may be done on the next proceeding Business Day.
- (h) In relation to the Easement Area:
 - (i) a reference to a thing on, or the doing of any thing on or in respect of, land in the Easement Area includes a reference to a thing, or the doing of the thing, through, over, across or under the land; and
 - (ii) a reference to land in the Easement Area includes the land's surface, sub-surface and strata above the surface.

3. Grant of Easement

The Chief Executive, on behalf of the State, is acquiring this Easement in perpetuity to permit the State:

- (a) a right of support, that is, so that the Easement Area protects and provides structural support to the Busway (as the dominant tenement). The Owner has an obligation not to withdraw that support or to permit or allow (by whatever means) that support to be withdrawn and the Owner must do all things necessary to ensure that the support of the Busway by the Easement Area that exists as at the Date of the Easement is maintained at all times and from time to time and is not withdrawn;
- (b) to give prior written approval by the Chief Executive under clause 8 to all New Improvements to be constructed within that part of the Easement Area that is within the boundaries of the Owner's Land to ensure that any New Improvements will not compromise the Busway's structural integrity;
- (c) to enter upon, inspect and traverse the Owner's Land for the purposes of preventing or rectifying any obstruction or infringement by the Owner of the State's rights under this Easement, provided that, except in the case of emergency, entry onto the Owner's Land is required to be subject to prior reasonable notice; and
- (d) to authorise, permit or license third parties to use the Easement Area for the same purposes as the State may do so under this Easement and otherwise to exercise the same rights and entitlements as the State under this Easement, in accordance with the terms of this Easement.

4. Chief Executive's rights

- (a) The Chief Executive may, in connection with the use and enjoyment of this Easement, exercise such of the Chief Executive's rights, powers, discretions and functions under the Transport Act and the TPC Act, or any other Act or at law as the Chief Executive sees fit.
- (b) For the avoidance of doubt, the parties agree that the terms of this Easement do not and are not intended to fetter any statutory discretion.
- (c) Subject to clause 4(a) and 4(b), this Easement restricts the non-statutory discretion of the Chief Executive.

5. The State's obligation to the Owner

- (a) The State will, in exercising its rights pursuant to this Easement:
 - (i) cause as little inconvenience to the Owner as possible; and
 - (ii) act reasonably.
- (b) The State will:
 - (i) comply with all laws regarding the use of this Easement and the safety of persons upon the Easement Area; and
 - (ii) not be liable for:
 - (A) the negligent acts or omissions of the Owner; or
 - (B) the acts or omissions of the Owner that are a breach of this Easement or of the law.

6. Use of the Easement Area by the Owner

- (a) The Owner:
- (i) may use the Easement Area for:
 - (A) any use contemplated by a Development Application as approved; and
 - (B) any other lawful purpose not inconsistent with the terms of this Easement which does not, in the Chief Executive's opinion, compromise the structural integrity of the Busway.
 - (ii) may construct New Improvements within the Easement Area but only in accordance with the requirements of clause 8.
- (b) The Owner may only use the Easement Area for the purposes contained in clause 6(a) and for no other purpose without the Chief Executive's prior written consent which may be given or refused or given on such conditions as the Chief Executive may determine in its absolute discretion.

7. The Owner's obligations**7.1 Obligations**

The Owner must:

- (a) ensure that the Owner or others authorised by the Owner comply with this Easement in relation to the use of the Easement Area;
- (b) comply with all laws in relation to the use of the Easement Area; and
- (c) subject to clause 6, comply with the Chief Executive's reasonable directions in relation to the use of the Easement Area.

7.2 Prohibitions

- (a) The Owner must not:
- (i) interfere with or obstruct the State in the exercise or enjoyment of its rights and powers under this Easement;
 - (ii) do or permit to be done anything in the Easement Area which would be contrary to the obligations imposed on the Owner in clause 3(a) (including allowing plant, machinery or objects on the Easement Area which may exceed the Engineering Specifications); or
 - (iii) without the prior written approval of the State obtained in accordance with clause 8, alter or disturb or permit to be altered or disturbed the grades and contours of the Easement Area.
- (b) The Owner must refrain from doing anything and the Owner must not do anything or permit or allow anything to be done on, in or through the Easement Area which:
- (i) will or may interfere with or endanger or affect (then or in the future) the operation, structural integrity or the physical integrity of the Busway;
 - (ii) will or may cause any damage (then or in the future) to the Busway; or
 - (iii) will or may cause (then or in the future) an additional requirement for the State to carry out maintenance, repair and/or replacement of the Busway. An additional requirement is a new or further requirement (including a requirement which involves the expenditure of additional money) which but for the thing done on, in or through the Easement Area would not have been required.

7.3 Acknowledgement

The parties acknowledge and agree that carrying out New Improvements in accordance with clause 8 does not breach clause 7.2.

8. New Improvements

- (a) Prior to carrying out any New Improvements within the Easement Area, the Owner must obtain the prior written approval of the Chief Executive. The Chief Executive's approval may not be unreasonably withheld but may be granted subject to any conditions the Chief Executive thinks fit to impose.

- (b) The Owner must at the same time it makes any request for the Chief Executive's approval under clause 8(a), provide the Chief Executive with:
- (i) details of any contractor the Owner proposes to engage to carry out the New Improvements for information only;
 - (ii) evidence that the Owner has effected such insurances as the Chief Executive may reasonably require;
 - (iii) detailed geotechnical information regarding the New Improvements in a form and containing such information as the Chief Executive may reasonably require;
 - (iv) detailed engineering specifications regarding the New Improvements in a form and containing such information as the Chief Executive may reasonably require. When preparing the engineering specifications the Owner must comply with the Engineering Specifications; and
 - (v) such other information regarding the New Improvements as the Chief Executive may reasonably require.
- (c) Within a reasonable time after receiving the Owner's application under clause 8(b), the Chief Executive must:
- (i) approve the Owner's application;
 - (ii) refuse to approve the Owner's application; or
 - (iii) approve the Owner's application subject to reasonable and relevant conditions, including conditions relating to;
 - (A) certification of the New Improvements by the Chief Executive;
 - (B) releasing the State from liability;
 - (C) indemnities in favour of the State by the Owner; and
 - (D) ongoing rights of the Chief Executive to inspect, having regard to the nature of the rights of the Chief Executive and State granted under this Easement.
- (d) If the Chief Executive refuses to approve the Owner's application under clause 8(c)(ii), the Chief Executive must give the Owner the Chief Executive's reasons for that refusal.

9. Indemnity

9.1 Owner's Indemnity to the State

The Owner indemnifies the State and agrees to keep the State indemnified against:

- (a) all damage to the property of the State; and
- (b) all claims, costs, and losses incurred by the State, caused by or arising out of -
 - (c) the use of the Easement Area, the New Improvements or both; or
 - (d) a breach of any of the provisions of this Easement; or
 - (e) a breach of a statutory duty to which the Owner is subject,

by the Owner or others authorised by the Owner to use the Easement Area. However, the Owner is not required to indemnify the State for damage to the property of the State or for claims, costs and losses incurred by the State to the extent that they are caused by the wilful or negligent acts of the State or its employees or agents.

9.2 State's indemnity to the Owner

The State indemnifies the Owner and agrees to keep the Owner indemnified against:

- (a) all damage to the property of the Owner; and
- (b) all claims, costs, and losses incurred by the Owner,

caused by or arising out of -

- (c) entry for inspection purposes under clause 3;
- (d) a breach of any of the provisions of this Easement; or
- (e) a breach of a statutory duty to which the State is subject,

by the State or others authorised by the State to use the Easement Area. However, the State is not required to indemnify the Owner for damage to the property of the Owner or for claims, costs and losses incurred by the Owner to the extent that they are caused by the wilful or negligent acts of the Owner or its employees or agents.

10. Progressive surrender of this Easement

10.1 Acknowledgement and Owner's Notice

The parties acknowledge and agree that:

- (a) subject to the State's rights under this Easement, the Owner's Development Application may involve the creation of community title scheme land pursuant to the provisions of the *Body Corporate and Community Management Act 1997 (Scheme Land)*; and
- (b) if any Scheme Land is created then the Owner may by written notice to the State (the **Owner's Notice**), require the State to surrender this Easement but only so far as it relates to lots on a building format plan (and any substitution therefore in the future) (**Building Format Lots**) created as part of any Scheme Land.

10.2 State's Surrender

- (a) Upon receipt of the Owner's Notice under clause 10.1, the State agrees to:
 - (i) take all necessary steps, as promptly as reasonably practicable, for the partial surrender of this Easement, but only so far as it relates to the Building Format Lots; and
 - (ii) promptly notify the Owner when this step has been completed.
- (b) If required to do so by the State, the Owner must promptly sign and return any documents required to give effect to the surrender referred to in clause 10.2(a).

10.3 Not applicable to common areas or airspace above improvements

Despite anything to the contrary, the State is under no obligation to surrender or partially surrender this Easement in relation to other parts of the Scheme Land including any common areas forming part of the Scheme Land or in relation to airspace above the improvements constructed within the Easement Area.

Engineering Specifications

1.0 Permissible Loading on the Easement Area

Loadings to be applied to the Easement Area by any party may be the loading which produces the equivalent member action to that produced by the live load and superimposed dead load and concentrated loads noted in clause 1.1 and 1.2.

1.1 Live Load and Superimposed Dead Load

The total combined design action effects of fill, traffic loads and construction load must not exceed those that are resultant from a uniformly distributed load of 30 kPa with an ultimate design load factor of 1.5.

Queensland Competition Authority Act 1997
Sections 23a**REFERRAL****1. Referral**

As the responsible Minister, pursuant to section 23A of the *Queensland Competition Authority Act 1997* (the QCA Act), I refer the Gladstone Area Water Board (GAWB) to the Queensland Competition Authority (the Authority) for a price monitoring investigation for the period from 1 July 2015 to 30 June 2020.

2. Conduct of the QCA pursuant to this referral

In referring this investigation, the Authority is to consider:

- a) the planned change in prices of water having regard to, amongst other things:
 - i. GAWB's pricing model; and
 - ii. demand forecasts;
- b) the forecast revenue based on the total prudent and efficient costs of carrying on the activity;
- c) in respect of the return on capital consider the WACC applied by GAWB against the benchmark WACC;
- d) the regulated asset base (RAB) roll-forward calculation (in accordance with the Authority's previously recommended methodology);
- e) the revenue carryover calculation (in accordance with the Authority's previously recommended methodology);
- f) for capital expenditure to be included in the forecast RAB, the Authority is to form a view on prudence and efficiency, with the focus on cost areas which are material to price changes rather than matters which are likely to have a minor and inconsequential impact; and
- g) for operating expenditure to be included in the forecast revenue, the Authority may investigate the expenditure in any function where GAWB's forecast expenditure in that function exceeds the level allowed in the Authority's 2010 pricing practices investigation by an amount that would give rise to a material increase in price.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Authority may consider a matter not indicated in (a) to (g) if it is likely to have a material impact on the price to a customer.

3. Consultation

The Authority must undertake an open consultation process with all relevant parties and consider submissions within the timetable for the review and reports. Consistent with section 34 of the QCA Act, all reports and submissions must be published on the Authority's website.

4. Timing

GAWB is to provide a submission to the Authority in respect of its pricing practices by 30 September 2014.

The Authority must provide a Draft Report by 28 February 2015 and a Final Report by 31 May 2015.
