In 2019, as part of the Dancing CEOs initiative, Elena Gosse achieved the highest individual fundraising effort in the event's history. Dancing CEO's is the event that raises funds to enable WLSQ frontline workers provide free legal and welfare services for women and children in domestic violence situations. Recently Elena Gosse was recognised as part of Westfield Local Hero and Queensland Community Foundation philanthropist awards programs with final results to be announced shortly. During the pandemic, when major fundraising events have been cancelled, AIS Water and Elena have continued to support WLSQ with fundraising and public speaking initiatives. At MATE, the belief is that everyone's a leader and everyone has the capacity to Be Someone Who Does Something. MATE training challenges root attitudes, beliefs and behaviours that normalise problematic behaviour, and creates a safe environment for people to share their opinions and experiences about these volatile issues. Ultimately, MATE seeks to inspire leadership by empowering participants with the tools to feel confident addressing harmful and abusive behaviour. Since delivering MATE, the MATE team has diversified its packages to include a partnership with the Allison Baden-Clay Foundation, delivering domestic violence bystander specific training. The MATE team has also introduced training specific to racism and discrimination and bullying and harassment. Ruth's Women's Shelter Cairns Inc.	Ruth's Women's Shelter Cairns Inc. is a not-for-profit organisation and charity that provides secure crisis accommodation ensuring optimum safety, guidance and support to women and children escaping domestic and family violence. Ruth's has been operating in Cairns since 1977 thanks to the foresight of the four women founders, Ruth Thomas, Pat O'Hara, Joan Trewern and Jean Bleyerveld, who initially formed the Women's Electoral Lobby in Cairns in 1975. Ruth's believes women and children have the right to live a life free of violence. It assists women to work towards this goal by creating a non-judgmental, respectful and dignified environment. In 2020, Ruth's officially opened a new initiative, Ruth's Hub. Ruth's Hub is a safe place where women and children can access information and support around domestic violence issues. It is the first of its kind in Queensland. Ruth's has also invested significantly over the past few years in properties that are managed by a local real estate agent, and are available for women and children moving on from the shelter. Families moving into these properties continue to be supported by workers at the shelter. Ruth's has a formal partnership with Access Community Housing, who have recently invested significantly in properties designed with victims of domestic violence in mind. With additional security features, Ruth's are given priority nomination rights, and a number of families have transitioned from the shelter to these properties. Ruth's has an MOU with Centacare FNQ to provide funding for an emergency relief program. Families at the shelter can access assistance to purchase essential goods, including food, clothing, medication and transport. Siaki and Sons Removalists	John Siaki, the founder of Siaki and Sons Removalists, was working as a removalist and witnessed an incident of domestic violence. It made John feel powerless just as a witness. It shocked John so much he decided he needed to do something about it. Growing up in a Pacific Islander community men are taught to respect all women. When he returned home he spoke to his wife about the incident and what he should do. His wife advised him to use his truck as a way to help. Siaki and Sons Removalists now help many in domestic violence situations flee the abuse and usually average four domestic violence moves a week. However, since the COVID-19 pandemic, the company has had a strong rise in demand, assisting with 10 moves per week. John believes this is due to the financial stress and isolation caused by the pandemic. Many of the moves are done in secret and with urgency while the partner is away, at work or while in custody. John has stated that you can tell by the tone in people's voices that they are in a really serious situation and in need of help. Siaki and Sons have processes in place to remove the items needed and quickly move that person out.
