Vehicle Standards Instruction

Gas system installations under the National Code of Practice for Light Vehicle Construction and Modification September 2021

In 2012, the National Code of Practice for Light Vehicle Construction and Modification (NCOP) was adopted for use in Queensland. While most of modifications permitted under the NCOP are permitted in Queensland, a small number of variations have been included.

Under the LM2 and LM3 sections in NCOP, includes provisions for the installation and modification of Liquid Petroleum Gas (LPG) and Natural Gas (NG) systems on light motor vehicles to be certified. However, as the installation and modification of gas systems is not regulated by the Department of Transport and Main Roads, these codes have not been adopted for use in Queensland.

Note, under the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management - Vehicle Standards and Safety) Regulation 2021* (the VSS Regulation), the owner of a modified vehicle must ensure that a modification that requires approval has been approved, before the vehicle is used on a road.

Modifying a vehicle that adversely affects its safety or driving or parking an unsafe vehicle on a road, are breaches of the VSS Regulation.
