				The State Chaplaincy Board consists of seven faith-based organisations which deliver this service on a minimum of 4 weekdays plus a Sunday service, 52 weeks a year.



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Members of the Islamic Council of Queensland visit two correctional centres in SEQ every week and during religious events/ceremonies including Ramadan. Special visits were also made following the recent incident in Christchurch.
Rabbis and other members of the Jewish faith visit correctional centres including at times of religious significance, e.g. Passover.
Work continues to increase the level of access prisoners have to religious leaders from these and other faiths.
